Pyithu Hluttaw regular session continues for 18th day

NAY PYI TAW, 31 July—Pyithu Hluttaw regular session continued for 18th day at Pyithu Hluttaw Hall in Hluttaw Complex here this morning, attended by Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann and 402 Pyithu Hluttaw representatives.

At today's session, four questions were answered, one proposal discussed, one proposal submitted and one bill discussed.

Deputy Minister for Agriculture and Irrigation U Khin Zaw answered questions raised by two Hluttaw representatives.

Regarding the question raised by U Bo Ni of Yamethin Constituency on "launching educative measures in all regions and states after testing mineral ingredients in lands of each region and state", the deputy minister answered that the ministry opened land utilization divisions in each region and state to disseminate knowledge for choosing fertilizers and crops, testing ingredients in lands.

Regarding the question raised by U Francisco of Pekhon Constituency, on behalf of U Khin Maung Myint of Yaksawk Constituency on "dredging silts at Moebye Dam and canals, repair of sluice gates and resuming voyage between Inlay Lake and Loikaw", the deputy minister answered

Hluttaw Complex here today, attended by Amyotha Hluttaw Speaker U Khin Aung Myint and 211 MPs.

Union Minister for Home Affairs Lt-Gen Ko Ko replied to four questions. Regarding the question of U Pe Thuang

about whether there is any plan to upgrade Hopin Sub-township in Mohnyin Township into township level,

the Union Minister replied that the sub-township is constituted with one town, four wards, eight village-tracts and

To attract more FDIs

Our government has already formed the Myanmar Investment Commission (MIC) which is now in operation with the internationally accepted system covering the job of providing investor protection, environmental conservation, social impact protection, and ensuring transparency and accountability in financial sector as the main agenda. MIC also encourages job creation by employees and technology transfer, and defines corporate social responsibility (CSR) and factors which must be gradually taken into consideration in weighing investment proposals.

We have more good news and that is based on the recommendations from experts and suggestions on resource related investment we are in the process of applying the internationally-acknowledged Extractive Industry Transparency Initiatives (EITI) in the near future.

But the sanctions imposed on Myanmar make us impossible to get any assistance from international monetary institutions and organizations such as World Bank, IMF, ADB and UNDP for our nation-building endeavours through democracy transition. In any circumstances, the government has been striving with high enthusiasm for extending our technical know-how and international economic engagement. Sadly, sanctions are still hampering our efforts.

Anyhow, we are inviting more foreign direct investments to our country from anywhere around the world. As for the FDIs the Myanmar Investment Commission has laid down the four principles, which are, to protect the interest of Myanmar citizens; to protect the dignity of the State; to protect national sovereignty; and to allow environmental friendly investment.

Moreover we are working in cooperation with international experts to enact the Myanmar Foreign Investment Law. And we hope that when the Myanmar Foreign Investment Law comes into force it will attract more foreign direct investments that will serve both the interest of our nation and our people and the investors and help improve our economy grow vigorously.

Iran says to keep Hormuz open as long as it serves its interests

DUBAI, 31 July—Iran will keep the vital Strait of Hormuz shipping lane open as long as the waterway served its interests, a military commander was on Monday quoted as saying.

Iranian politicians and officials have often said that Iran could block the strait—the neck of the Gulf through which 40 percent of the world's seaborne oil exports passes—in response to sanctions or military action.

Such a move would risk a military response from the United States and Foreign Minister Ali Akbar Salehi told

Reuters in July that Iran was unlikely to follow through on the threat unless its own vessels were denied use of the strait.

"Iran's goal is for everyone in the world to use the Strait of Hormuz but as long as it does not harm Iran's interests and in that case our reaction would definitely be different," IRNA news agency quoted senior Revolutionary Guards commander Masoud Jazayeri as telling Iran's Arabic-language Al Alam television.

"Most military experts know that if Iran decides to

close the Strait of Hormuz, no country or countries would be able to confront this move," he added, according to IRNA.

Experts say that a heavy Western naval presence in the Gulf and surrounding area is a big impediment to any attempt to block the waterway.

Israel and the United States have threatened military action against Iran unless it abandons nuclear activities which the West suspects are intended to develop nuclear weapons.

Tehran says its nuclear programme is for peaceful purposes.—Reuters

Car crash kills three, injures another in Japan's Kagawa

OSAKA, 31 July—A passenger car smashed into road-side trees early Tuesday in the western Japanese Kagawa Prefecture, killing three people and wounding another, local media said.

According to the country's public broadcaster Nippon Hoso Kyokai (NHK), the accident happened at around 1 am local time when the passenger car struck the trees on a national road in Kanonji City of the prefecture.

NHK cited local police as saying that the car with the four people on board hit directly hit the trees and a lamppost nearby, adding that the vehicle turned over after the crash.—Xinhua

Govt says Osprey test flights must address safety

TOKYO, 31 July—The Japanese government says the US military's new Osprey transport aircraft should not fly freely in training but instead pay proper attention to Japan's public safety.

A meeting of foreign and defence officials from the United States and Japan is debating specific measures to allay safety concerns over the Ospreys. The US plans to deploy the aircraft at the US Marine Corps' Futenma Air Station in Okinawa later this year.

At a Cabinet meeting on Tuesday, the government prepared for Diet questioning by the opposition Japanese Communist Party.

The government's draft reply says while US military planes are not subject to Japanese law governing the lowest altitude for emergency landings, this does not mean the aircraft can fly freely.

The government says Japan should request the US to ensure the safety of the aircraft to the maximum and limit any impact on local residents to the minimum.—NHK

Gunmen storm Yemen ministry, seize Italian

SANAA, 31 July—Gunmen kidnapped an Italian embassy security officer in Yemen on Sunday and some 100 armed tribesmen loyal to former President Ali Abdullah Saleh stormed the Interior Ministry, demanding to be enlisted in the police force, officials said.

A spokesman for the Italian Foreign Ministry in Rome said a security officer who is a member of the country's Carabinieri military police had been seized in Yemen and that a crisis committee had been activated. The spokesman declined to give further details.

A security source in Yemen, who told Reuters the kidnapping victim was a diplomat, said he had been near the Italian embassy when "men came by in a car and took him by force".

Earlier, tribesmen briefly held interior ministry employees hostage. They freed the ministry personnel a

few hours later but continued to occupy the building, a ministry official said.

The incidents highlighted the continuing turmoil in Yemen despite a peace deal under which Saleh stood down after months of protests against his 33-year rule and was replaced in February by his deputy, Abd-Rabbu Mansour Hadi.

The ministry storming was a direct challenge to Hadi's authority. He is trying to restructure the armed forces and stabilise the impoverished Arab nation, where Saleh's legacy still looms large.

The Interior Ministry official said the tribesmen were Saleh loyalists, who were promised they would be enrolled in the police force in return for helping tackle last year's uprising. The promise has not been fulfilled.

"At midday, the armed tribesmen... stormed the ministry building, took control of it and climbed onto

the roof with their guns," the official said. "They refuse to leave until their demands are met." Tribesmen have fought alongside government troops in a US-backed offensive against al Qaeda-linked militants that drove insurgents out of several towns in the south of the country last month. Many tribal fighters also sided with



Saleh who was toppled by a popular uprising.

Disgruntled tribesmen often kidnap foreigners and bomb oil and gas pipelines as a way to press demands on authorities.

In April, officers and tribesmen loyal to Saleh forced Yemen's main airport to close for a day in protest at the sacking of the air force commander, a half-brother of Saleh.—Reuters

Curry compound may curb diabetes risk: study

WASHINGTON, 31 July—Supplements containing a compound found in curry spice may help prevent diabetes in people at high risk, according to a Thai study.

Researchers, whose results were published in the journal Diabetes Care, found that over nine months, a daily dose of curcumin seemed to prevent new cases of diabetes among people with so-called prediabetes—abnormally high blood sugar levels that may progress to full-blown type 2 diabetes.

Curcumin is a compound in turmeric spice. Previous lab research has suggested it can fight inflammation and so-called oxidative damage to body cells. Those two processes are thought to feed a range of diseases, including type 2 diabetes.

"Because of its benefits and safety, we propose that

curcumin extract may be used for an intervention therapy for the prediabetes population," wrote study leader Somlak Chuengsamarn of Srinakharinwirot University in Nakornayok, Thailand.

The study included 240 Thai adults with prediabetes who were randomly assigned to take either curcumin capsules or a placebo. The ones taking curcumin took six supplement capsules a day,

each of which contained 250 milligrams of "curcuminoids". After nine months, 19 of the 116 placebo patients had developed type 2 diabetes. That compared with none of the 119 patients taking curcumin.

The researchers found that the supplement seemed to improve the function of beta-cells, which are cells in the pancreas that release the blood sugar-regulating hormone insulin.—Reuters

Lao network launches information campaign on HIV/AIDS

VIENTIANE, 31 July—The Laos' Network of People Living with HIV/AIDS (LNP+) has launched an information campaign across the country to help stop the rise in the number of people with HIV and raise people's awareness of the disease and its treatment.

Kinoy Phongdeth, head of the (LNP+) and himself HIV positive, said that there has been no such campaign in Laos. "I contacted partners and organized groups to bring in medication and to offer support to other HIV positive individuals like me," he said.

Phongdeth was the second person to be treated for HIV/AIDS in Laos. His experience led him to organize the network in order to help other people.

"After I discovered I was positive, I had a terrible shock and didn't know what to do. It dashed all plans and hopes for my future. I actually thought of committing suicide," Phongdeth said.

The incidence of HIV/AIDS in Laos is rising, but is still less compared to that of surrounding countries.

At present, there are an estimated 9,000 individuals with HIV/AIDS in Laos with some 1,000 new cases discovered last year. The total population of Laos is around 6.4 million.

LNP+, a peer-based non-profit association established in 2003, received official recognition by the Lao government this year.

Phongdeth, in collaboration with other HIV positive individuals, built the

network from scratch with donations from various agencies.

According to Phongdeth, the network's main goals are to assist HIV positive individuals in seeking treatment with government help and to raise awareness of the risks and how it is transmitted.

Phongdeth, who has attended the Washington International AIDS Conference held July 22-27, said he would share his experiences in establishing LNP+ with other people working in the same field worldwide and to learn from the work of others.

Phongdeth's LNP+ is working hard to remove the stigma associated with being HIV positive.

Net-casting spider hunt filmed in wild

LONDON, 31 July — High-speed footage of a net-casting spider's hunting technique has been recorded by a film crew. As ambush hunters, the spiders are known to use a combination of touch and well-developed sight to sense prey. The video reveals the rarely-seen, split-second technique of the species as it snatches an unsuspecting cricket in a Central American forest. The team believe this is the first slow-motion footage to show a net-casting spider hunting in the wild. Expert, Dr George McGavin, who witnessed the event said: "I would compare it to watching a big cat kill. It's as exciting as that."

The film crew were in central America filming wildlife for a new nature series, *The Dark: Nature's Nighttime World*.

They waited for five hours with the cameras trained on the spider until the cricket strayed into the killing zone beneath the net. "The spider did not move a muscle until the antenna of that prey item, the cricket, touched the thread." As soon as it touched it, [the spider] was on it in a thousandth of a second," said Dr McGavin, "if we hadn't had that camera, you wouldn't have seen a thing."

"It was the most exciting thing I've ever seen," he said. Net-casting spiders are found across the world in tropical and sub-tropical regions and are also known as ogre-faced spiders because of their distinctive big eyes, which help it to see prey during nighttime hunts. But on this occasion, the team also captured the important moment that triggers the spider's trap. When the cricket touched one of the net's anchoring threads with its antenna, it caused the spider to strike. "It's like a trip wire," said Craig Walker, deputy team leader for invertebrates at the Zoological Society of London. "It'll send a vibration to the spider." The spiders construct their webs in stages, first building a scaffold at a spot under which its prey is likely to pass. "It's almost like manufacturing your own workbench so that you can make something on it," Mr Walker told *BBC Nature*.

The spider then carefully crafts its distinctive net using a different type of silk. "They spin some of the silk at its most extended so its already at full stretch when its spun so that when its off the scaffold it'll immediately shrink to its non-stretched size," he said.

"They hit the prey with it at full stretch and then they relax it so that it gets caught into it, almost like a purse net." Sometimes spiders of this genus use an extra technique to help them to pick out their prey at night. "(They) will spend a little while spraying faeces on to the ground which dry white and then the dark animal has to run across it and it's a bit like putting a flash light on something," said Mr Walker.

Frogs rescued from killer fungus have 'massive' brood

LONDON, 31 July — Rare tropical frogs rescued from a killer fungus in the Caribbean have produced a bumper brood in the UK. The two female mountain chicken frogs responsible for the 76 new additions are part of an attempt to rescue the species from extinction. All 12 frogs in the UK breeding programme came from Montserrat, where the chytrid fungus has ravaged the population.

"We're absolutely chuffed to bits," said herpetologist, Dr Ian Stephen. The frogs, simply known as mountain chickens, were rescued as part of the conservation efforts led by the Zoological Society of London (ZSL) and the Durrell Wildlife Conservation Trust (DWCT).

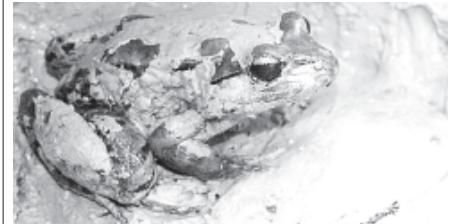
"The first challenge was getting them out of the Caribbean into Europe safely,"

said Dr Ian Stephen, ZSL's Curator of Herpetology. The frogs were transported in temperature-controlled boxes to protect them and minimise stress on the long and hazardous journey.

"Although the mountain chicken is one of the biggest frogs in the world they're still a small animal so they're incredibly sensitive to temperature fluctuations and that tends to be the thing that would kill a frog during transportation." "It's obviously quite a hairy moment when you open up the boxes," he said.

The 50 airlifted frogs were split into three groups and housed at ZSL London Zoo, the DWCT in Jersey and at Parken Zoo in Sweden in the hope of growing a healthy population of the species.

Microsoft pays big to strengthen software defence

WASHINGTON, 31 July — As hackers from around the world converged on Las Vegas, Microsoft doled out a quarter million dollars in prize money to researchers who found ways to thwart attacks on its software.

The winners of Microsoft's first Blue Hat prize were unveiled at a hip club at a mobbed party complete with dancers, high-energy DJ, and explosions of shimmering confetti.

A top prize of \$200,000 went to doctoral student Vasilis Pappas for an advance

in countering "the most popular attack techniques we're seeing today," said Microsoft security response centre senior director Mike Reavey.

"We posed a challenge to the researcher community and asked them to shift their focus from solely identifying and reporting individual vulnerabilities to investing in new lines of defensive research that could mitigate entire classes of attacks," Reavey said of the prize.

Microsoft awarded

\$50,000 to the second-place finisher, and a fortune in software to the researcher who placed third out of the 20 submissions entered in the Blue Hat competition.

Technology from the finalists has been integrated into a software toolkit for protecting against threats, according to Microsoft trustworthy computer group general manager Matt Thomlinson.

"The Blue Hat prize is more than a competition; it's the future of security defense, where the community comes together to collectively take on some of the toughest problems we face and make the computing ecosystem safer," Thomlinson said.

Each of the top three entries dealt with a way cyber attackers twist snippets of benign software already in a computer system to malicious ends, according to Microsoft.

The Blue Hat winners were announced at a Black Hat conference of computer security professionals gave way to the largest known gathering of hackers, Def Con, which ends Sunday.

"If you look at some of the bigger companies of the last few years like Facebook they just came out of one idea and they've changed the way we live and work," he said. — Internet

SEC alleges insider trading ahead of CNOOC-Nexen deal

WASHINGTON, 31 July — The US securities regulator filed a complaint in court on Friday against a firm controlled by a Chinese billionaire and other traders, accusing them of making over \$13 million from insider trading ahead of a bid by China's CNOOC for Canadian oil company Nexen Inc. The Securities and Exchange Commission said the federal court in Manhattan had frozen assets worth over \$38 million belonging to Hong Kong-based Well Advantage, controlled by businessman Zhang Zhirong, and other unnamed traders

who used accounts in Hong Kong and Singapore to trade in Nexen stock.

They made trading profits of \$7 million and \$6 million respectively by using inside knowledge of the merger to buy Nexen shares before the announcement, the SEC says.

The trading was suspicious, the SEC claims in its complaint, because the accounts used to buy the shares had "either no history or extremely limited history" of buying Nexen shares before July 2012.

CNOOC said on 23 July it had agreed to acquire Nexen for \$15.1 billion, China's

biggest foreign takeover bid. Shares of Nexen jumped almost 52 percent that day.

The unnamed Singapore traders used accounts in the names of Phillip Securities and Citibank, while Well Advantage made its trades through accounts held at UBS Securities and Citigroup Global Markets. Neither of the Well Advantage accounts had traded Nexen shares since January 2012, and the Citigroup account had been completely dormant for over six months.

Zhang Zhirong also controls China Rongsheng Heavy Industries Group Holdings, which according to a company filing in October 2010, entered a strategic cooperation agreement with CNOOC.

A spokeswoman for CNOOC declined to comment. Calls to Well Advantage's office in Hong Kong were not answered on Saturday. Hong Kong's Securities and Futures Commission also declined comment while officials at the Monetary Authority of Singapore were not immediately available.

Driving sobriety tests likely to miss medical pot

NEW YORK, 31 July — A new, small study suggests medicinal marijuana may impair users' driving skills - but might be missed by typical sobriety tests. At doses used in AIDS, cancer and pain patients, people weaved side to side more and had a slower reaction time in the hours after using the drug, researchers from the Netherlands found. For people who hadn't built up a tolerance to marijuana, those effects were similar to driving with a blood alcohol content of 0.08, the point at which drivers are considered legally impaired, they said.

"At this time, we know very little about the possible effects that medical marijuana may have on, say, motor vehicle crash rates, injury rates and mortality rates," said Dr Guohua Li, who has studied marijuana and traffic accidents at Columbia University in New York but wasn't involved in the new research. "There is a concern medical marijuana may interact with other drugs such as alcohol that may further compromise driving safety," he added.

The new study involved 12 frequent marijuana users

and 12 occasional (three times a month at most) smokers. At three different points, researchers led by Wendy Bosker of Maastricht University gave each of the participants either a 20 milligram or 10 mg pill of dronabinol - medical marijuana - or a drug-free placebo pill.

Pfizer to return rights to three Acura products

LONDON, 31 July — Pfizer Inc will return three products it was developing using Acura Pharmaceuticals Inc's abuse-resistant technology, Acura said on Friday. The license termination, which concerns three clinical-stage products using Acura's Aversion technology, will be effective a year from Thursday, when Pfizer notified the company.

"We will evaluate our strategy for these products (being returned) over the coming months, including possible partnering with alternative strategic partners," Acura chief executive Bob Jones said in a statement.

The pharmaceutical giant will retain rights to Oxecta - a pain management pill that also uses Acura's technology - which is

already on the market, Acura said. Pfizer will return all assets and regulatory and clinical responsibility related to the three drugs, MacKay Jameson, a spokesman for Pfizer, told Reuters via email.

Acura had received an aggregate of \$78.5 million in payments from Pfizer as of 31 March, under their 2007 license agreement.

It was eligible to receive tiered royalties of 5 percent to 25 percent on combined annual net sales of all products marketed under the agreement.

Acura will earn royalties on Oxecta sales from the first quarter of 2013.

Shares of Palatine, Illinois-based Acura closed at \$3.08 on Friday on the Nasdaq. They fell to \$2.60 in after-market trade.

LONDON, 31 July — A Russian court has ordered BP to pay \$3.1bn (£1.97bn) in damages to its Russian joint venture over a failed Arctic oil exploration deal with Rosneft.

The case against BP was brought by Andrei Prokhorov, a minority shareholder, on behalf of TNK-BP Holding. He claims that the proposed alliance damaged TNK-BP's interests because it lost out on a

lucrative opportunity. BP said it will challenge the ruling. TNK-BP is jointly owned by BP and AAR, a group of four Soviet oligarchs. AAR successfully blocked the tie-up last year in a European court, saying BP had breached its shareholder agreement with TNK-BP, which stipulated that the unit was the UK group's primary vehicle for investments in Russia. Mr Prokhorov initially valued the lost opportunity

at around \$13bn, although he later reduced the amount to some \$8bn. Mr Prokhorov, who owns about 0.00001%, has denied AAR's connection to the suit. Friday's ruling, by an arbitration-based court in Siberia, is against London-based BP and the group's BP Russia Investment Limited venture.

The British group is now directly negotiating the sale of its 50% stake in TNK-BP to Rosneft. "We consider the court decision as unjustified. Today's ruling will be challenged in the court of appeal," BP said in a statement.

"All the plaintiff's arguments are based on absurd assumptions, and are not related to either the company's interests, or the

interests of its shareholders. TNK-BP did not suffer and could not have suffered any damages," from the failed deal with Rosneft, it said.

"TNK-BP initially was not considered as possible participant in the Arctic projects by Rosneft. We consider this claim as an attempted corporate attack and believe that today's ruling should be cancelled." A lawyer for plaintiff Mr Prokhorov said his client was "fully satisfied."

"For us, this decision was not a surprise," said attorney Dmitry Chepurenskiy. BP's attempted share swap with Rosneft last year was part of an ambitious plan by the UK company to develop oil fields in the Arctic. The Arctic deal eventually went to ExxonMobil. — Internet

Italy business lobby sees urgent need for euro bank union

MILAN, 31 July — Italy's biggest business lobby called on Saturday for quick implementation of a European Union summit decision last month to create a banking union, as credit in Italy and other peripheral euro-zone countries dries up. "The euro-zone bank union must

be implemented more quickly than what was decided at end of June, with supervision and risks joined together and direct recapitalization of banks by the EFSF-ESM funds," Confindustria research body CSC said in a study.

European Central Bank

president Mario Draghi on Thursday pledged to do whatever was necessary to protect the euro zone from collapse, prompting hopes of an ambitious new programme.

"The extraordinary intervention of the ECB of two rounds of three-year loans

has prevented the violent credit crunch from worsening. But in many cases this is no longer enough," CSC said. The study said heavy buying of government bonds would repair banks' battered balance sheets and help reduce disparity between credit conditions in Europe's core and periphery.

Ethnic clashes in Ethiopia kill 18

MOYALE, 31 July—Ethnic clashes in southern Ethiopia have left 18 dead and scores displaced, the Kenya Red Cross Society (KRCS) reported, but the Ethiopian government told AFP Sunday the situation was under control.

The clashes erupted Thursday in an area about a mile (1.6 kilometres) from the Kenyan border, between the Borana and Garri tribes over a land dispute, KRCS said in a statement. The Ethiopian government said the spat was over "administrative claims" by the two sides.

"The local authorities

were not able to resolve the claims and counterclaims in a constructive manner so clashes ensued," Ethiopian government spokesman, Bereket Simon, told AFP, without giving details on the toll.

Bereket said police had made several arrests.

"Federal police and government have intervened and all the culprits are under control," he said, adding that the situation has now "normalized."

According to the KRCS statement, "at least 18 deaths and 12 injuries had been confirmed" and the conflict

has also led to "loss of properties with reports of massive displacements of populations" into neighbouring Kenya.

KRCS says a registration to determine the actual displaced populations was ongoing but said "more than 10,000 people require urgent humanitarian support".

Bereket said the displaced people were expected to return to Ethiopia shortly. "This is a hiccup which we are going to address and they will be back soon... and will continue to live their normal lives," he said.

Helicopter crash kills three people in Mexico

MEXICO CITY, 31 July—Three people died in a helicopter crash in Mexico, the local Public Prosecutor's Office (PGJEM) said Sunday.

PGJEM said the crash occurred on Saturday night in Temoaya mountain range and one of the victims was businessman Juan Armando Hinojosa Jr.

According to the investigations, the tragedy happened when Hinojosa was returning from a lunch with the winner of 1 July presidential elections, Enrique Pena Nieto in his birthplace Atlacomulco, a town in the state of Mexico.

PGJEM said that local authorities at 23:40 local time (0440 GMT) on Saturday night realized the loss of the helicopter with the pilot, copilot and one passenger on it. The state Rescue Unit started the search of the aircraft and found on early Sunday morning the wreckage near the Jiquipilco-Temoaya highway, in Jiquipilco municipality.

The causes of the accident was still under investigation.—Xinhua

Shootout, gun attacks leave eight dead in Nigeria's Kano

KANO, 31 July—A gun battle near a mosque in the northern Nigerian city of Kano and two other shootings left at least eight people dead on Sunday in the latest violence to hit the area, authorities said.

It was not clear who was behind the attacks in the city of Kano, the largest in Nigeria's mainly Muslim north, but they resembled similar incidents in the past blamed on Islamist militant group Boko Haram.

The deadliest occurred

on Sunday night when gunmen opened fire in an area around a mosque while Muslims were observing Ramadan prayers and where a police team was already deployed to protect worshippers, a senior police official said.

Police and the attackers exchanged fire and one of the assailants was killed when his own explosive device went off.

Three other gunmen were shot dead by police, according to the official who

spoke on condition of anonymity.

"The rest fled, abandoning their car and three motorcycles they came with," the official said, adding that it was not clear whether police or the mosque was the target of the initial attack.

Earlier in the day, gunmen on a motorcycle opened fire on the car of a Nigerian air force officer, killing the driver and an aide, while two other people were killed in a nearby neighbourhood, authorities said.—Internet

Colombia's rebel group releases two pilots

BOGOTA, 31 July—The rebel Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia (FARC) Sunday released two civilian helicopter pilots kidnapped 20 days ago, said the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC).

Juan Carlos Alvarez and Alejandro de Jesus Ocampo were set free and handed over to representatives of the ICRC and a local non-governmental organization in a rural area of Argelia municipality in southwest Cauca province, the ICRC said in a statement. Both Alvarez and Ocampo were kidnapped by the

guerrillas on July 10, after their helicopter made emergency landing due to a mechanical failure. The helicopter was burned by FARC members.

"In this case, we participated (in the release) because the armed group asked us for help," said Jordi Raich, the ICRC representative in Colombia.

"We are pleased to have been able to make it possible for these people to be back with their loved ones," added Raich, who did not give any more details about the release. Last Wednesday, the

GUWAHATI, 30 July—India's home minister P Chidambaram Monday morning landed at the Gopinath Bordoloi airport and left by helicopter for riot affected Kokrajhar district in India's north east state of Assam where violence since July 20 killed 48 people and left 500,00 people homeless.

India's Prime Minister Manmohan Singh visited the area on Saturday and assured the victims living in refugee camps of an inquiry.

Clashes between Bodo tribesmen and Muslims began after a Muslim student leader was reportedly attacked. Despite deployment of para military forces and Indian army clashes continued for seven days.

Peru's president calls for unity on Independence Day

LIMA, 31 July—Peruvian President Ollanta Humala called here Sunday for unity to overcome difficulties facing Peru during celebrations marking the country's 191st anniversary of independence.

"Happy day for all the Peruvians. I wish the country's unity for the benefit of all," Humala said in a address to the nation at the Congress building on the last day of celebrations.

Humala said he would fulfill all the plans and programs set for his term's second year to eliminate poverty and defuse conflicts over mining.

"The conflicts of today worry all Peruvians. We need to overcome this culture of conflict," Humala said, referring to frequent disputes nationwide over natural resources.

The celebrations ended with a military parade in the downtown of Lima, the Peruvian capital.

Troops and cadets from Peru's army, navy and air force took part in the military parade in uniforms.

Representatives of firefighters, police officers and farmers also participated in the march.—Xinhua

S Korea's auto exports grow 3.1 pct in Q2

SEOUL, 31 July—South Korea's automobile exports grew 3.1 percent in the second quarter from a year earlier due to strong demand for large-sized cars from the United States, Australia and Russia, customs office data showed Monday. Exports of locally-made cars reached 10.85 billion US dollars during the April-June period, up 3.1 percent from the same period of last year, according to the Korea Customs Service (KCS). In terms of volume, South Korean automakers shipped 814,000 vehicles over the cited

period. The growth was attributed to solid popularity for large-sized cars with engine capacity of between 1.5 and 3 liters from the US, Australia and Russia, said the customs office. Shipments of autos with engine displacement from 1.5 to 3 liters reached 7.4 billion dollars during the quarter.

Imports surged 37.1 percent on-year to 992 million dollars in the second quarter, but trade surplus for the auto sector edged up 0.6 percent to 9.85 billion dollars over the same period thanks to falling prices of imported cars.

Average unit price of imported cars stood at 29,469 dollars a vehicle during the April-June period, down from 30,254 dollars three months earlier. Average export prices rose from 13,256 dollars a unit in the first quarter to 13,327 dollars in the second quarter.

For the first six months of this year, auto exports jumped 13.7 percent on-year to 21.74 billion dollars. Imports expanded 9.2 percent to 1.91 billion dollars over the cited period, sending the surplus for the sector to 19.83 billion dollars.—Xinhua

that 12.64 miles of main canal, three miles of tributaries and 20 minor canals would be dredged in 2012-2013 fiscal year. Budget will be requested for repairing irrigation system in 2013-2014 fiscal year. There is no plan to resume voyage between Inlay Lake and Loikaw of Kayah State.

Deputy Minister for Health Dr Win Myint answered questions raised by two Hluttaw representatives.

Regarding the question raised by Dr Maung Maung Wint of Bahan Constituency "plans of departments concerned for dissemination of information of quality drugs and safe foods", the deputy minister answered that Food and Drug Administration committees were formed at various levels. FDA is regularly checking food and drugs and issuing licenses and certificates for distribution and production of drugs. Licensed dealers are only allowed to import drugs. As regards the edible oil, FDA tests sample of the oil at its lab and issues license only when it finds the oil is suitable for public consumption. Edible oil quality control committee has been formed to monitor quality of edible oil.

Consumer Protection Bill has been submitted to Union Attorney-General Office in agreement with ASEAN Economic Community Implementation Committee. Workshops for consumer protection were held. Measures for public awareness, prevention against smuggling of unsafe drugs and consumer protection are being widely carried out.

Regarding the question raised by U Khun Lain of Falam Constituency on "construction of staff quarters for doctors of Falam People's Hospital, assigning doctors to two station hospitals in Falam Township, opening rural health centre in Zaungthe village in Falam Township and increasing cash assistance for graduates of nursing training school in Falam", the deputy minister answered that there is no plan currently to build staff quarters for doctors from mainland. The organizational structure of Falam People's Hospital is being reviewed at the request of Chin State government.

An assistant doctor (in-charge) is discharging duties at Lomban station hospital as of 7-4-2011 and the vacant post for an assistant doctor will be filled as soon as possible.

The request will be made for opening rural health centre in Zaungthe village within 2012-2013 fiscal year.

Meeting on swift implementation of socio-economic development held

YANGON, 31 July—Union Minister for Environmental Conservation and Forestry U Win Tun addressed the meeting on swift implementation of socio-economic development of the people at Head Office of Myanma Timber Enterprise here this morning.

The meeting was also attended by Yangon Region Hluttaw Speaker U Sein Tin Win, Deputy Speaker U Tin Aung, Yangon Region ministers and Region Hluttaw representatives, Director-General U Aye Myint Maung of Forest Department, region level departmental officials, deputy commissioners, township administrators, CEC members of the Republic of the Union of Myanmar Federation of Chambers of

Commerce and Industry and Industrialists Federation, scholars, entrepreneurs and reps of industrial zones and invited guests.

The Union Minister said in his address that the meeting was aimed at addressing challenges of business activities.

The government has made plans to reduce its timber extraction by five percent, he said.

He said the government has adopted policies and plans to carry out timber certification, to encourage private investment for establishing forest plantations, to reduce risks to the natural forest, encourage export of non-wood forest produce and improve forest service industry.

He invited suggestions for better

on 6 July, 2012 for the knowledge of the Hluttaw representatives.

The law has been submitted to Union government meeting No (26/2012) on 12 July, 2012 in order to legitimate the provisions of Chapter (12) Emoluments and Chapter (13) ward or village-tract administration law and Chapter (13) Office Operational Costs. Proceedings are going on in line with the procedures.

Further measures would be taken for appointment of ward or village-tract administrators upon approval of those financial provisions. The selection process would be carried out under the arrangement of the supervisory board in line with Section 6 and 7 of Chapter (4) of ward or village-tract administration law.

Regarding the question of U Myint Hlaing of Rakhine State Constituency No (12) about the rehabilitation measures of the Union government for sufferers of riots in Rakhine State to be able to restore original status and whether the ministry has any plan to adopt long-term plans for guaranteeing no reoccurrence of similar cases, full security, stability, and the rule of law, the Union Minister replied that Article 144 of Penal Code was issued in Sittway, Maungdaw, Buthidaung, Kyaukphe, Yanbye and Thandwe townships following the riots in June in Rakhine State so as to control the overall situation. The President issued ordinance according to Sub-section (a) of Section 413 of the Constitution, declaring the State of Emergency. Curfew order was issued in a b o v e - m e n t i o n e d townships on 8 and 1 June respectively, but the action of enforcement of Article 144 alone could not run administrative mechanism effectively and thus ordinance No. 1/2012 was issued on 10 June, declaring the State of Emergency in the entire state.

The President Office formed a team comprising the deputy minister for Social Welfare, Relief and Resettlement, deputy minister for Immigration and Population, and the Rakhine State government led by the

Union Minister of Border Affairs on 22 June, 2012 to manage the operation of relief camps, auditing and supervise rehabilitation tasks.

To restore normalcy, relief camps were opened as the first phase to give temporary shelters to sufferers of the riots and those fled out of fear, as the second phase, amount of losses were recorded and such urgent needs as tents, foods, drinking water, medicines and clothing were provided, and as the third phase plans are under operation to help them regenerate their original businesses and getting back on their feet.

According to the records till 8 July, 2012, 60 relief camps were opened in Sittway, four in Yathedaung, and seven in Maungdaw, totaling 71, providing help to 55495 persons. 395 out of 470 houses of nine burnt villages in Maungdaw Township were reconstructed and the remaining 94 houses were repaired. Until 2 July, 2012, 32 houses were built and 58 houses repaired.

The President Office assigned a team comprising the Western Command commander, deputy minister of Home Affairs and security and border affairs minister of the state government headed by the Union Minister for Home Affairs to undertake stability-restoration and rehabilitation tasks in Rakhine State on 22 June, 2012. Originally, only Rakhine nationals lived in Rakhine State, but later the ratio of Bengali to Rakhine nationals in Maungdaw and Buthidaung has become 94 to 6 per cent due to illegal immigration of Bengali and long-term settlement in the region.

Border Regions Immigration Inspection Command Headquarters is tightening the regulations in order to handle travelling, birth, death, immigration, migration, marriage, constructing of new religious buildings, repairing and land ownership and right to construct building of Bengalis under the law.

To control illegal trespassing into and out of Rakhine State and for perpetuity of sovereignty of the State, deterrence wall has

been built in Taungup and Buthidaung. Plans are under way to add further 30 police stations to original 75 police stations of Rakhine State Police Force and to upgrade eight police stations.

Regarding the question of U Khin Maung Yi of Ayeawady Region Constituency No (6) about if there is any plan to allocate fund for provision of adequate travel expenses, office utilities and office equipment to enable Myanmar Police Force to stand independently with dignity, the Union minister replied that the fund allocation for the MPF for 2012-2013 fiscal year under separate expenditure is 91.5 billion in total.

Additional 493.097 million kyats have been asked to provide travel allowances and daily allowances to civilian staff of the MPF. It has been planned to ask for capital fund of 2.788 billion kyats as 2012-2013 fiscal year additional expenditure within this fiscal year.

Systematic financial management has been introduced to enable MPF stand independently with dignity, replied the Union Minister.

Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Union U Soe Nyunt put forward bill amending Limitation Act, bill concerning Contempt of Court and bill amending Penal Code for debate at Amyotha Hluttaw. Each proposal was seconded by a MP.

They argued that plans must be consistent with accessible opportunities and objective conditions of the country. It is important to obtain accurate statistics and date in implementing the projects with transparency and a focus on rule of law. The accuracy of basic statistics and data, strong and weak

points and progress is important in implementing projects. Ministries are required to focus on details of the project in planning, to make a shift to leaner organizational structure and to assign right persons to right places. Reforms are a must for improvement of the administrative mechanism responsible for planning. It needs to adopt suitable economic system to the country that can assure rapid progress in short time. The bottom level needs to follow the instructions of the central administrative body. Likewise, the central executive body needs to consider the suggestions of the bottom level. It needs to make a shift of focus from agricultural development to industrial development, narrowing the rich-poor gap.

It is believed that systematic exploitation of natural resources with least impact on the environment would facilitate somewhat to industrial sector development of the country. Measures must be taken to turn the old mines into arable

land and forests. Gravels from mines could be used for roadworks, contributing to transportation. It is believed that the respective ministries through cooperative management could find a balance between environmental conservation and mining sector development.

The National Planning Committee decided to review the proposal.

Dr Khin Shwe of Yangon Region Constituency No (9), U Thein Hlaing of Sagaing Region Constituency No (8), U Ye Myint of Bago Region Constituency No (4), Dr Myint Kyi of Yangon Region Constituency No (8) and U Nay Win Tun of Shan State Constituency No (9) discussed the proposal of U Thein Win of Sagaing Region Constituency No (9) urging the Union government to undertake reforms for development of financial and legal infrastructure during the drafting of bill for monetary and capital market law.

They argued that it needs to enact law and rules and reinstitute infrastructure for protection of monetary and capital market in the drive for monetary and capital market development. Innovations are a must for protecting investment, supporting the development of business and smoothing business operations.

In initiating reforms for infrastructural development, the first step must be taken by investing in human resources development. Schooling reforms must be carried out in line with the changing conditions, linking the textbooks lessons to knowledge of universe. National people should prepare to enjoy the natural resources of the motherland, to keep abreast of international community and to welcome foreign investments. In addition, the State media and private media should educate the people.

Current banking system must be revised and monetary and banking services reforms must be implemented, promoting the investment sector.

Deputy Minister for Finance and Revenue U Win Shein discussed that The Planning and Finance Ministry and the Central Bank of Myanmar jointly initiated actions for capital market development of the country since 1990 under the permit of the Myanmar

Investment Commission. Myanama Economic Bank and Japan Daiwa Research Ltd established Myanmar Securities Exchange and Dealing Co Ltd on 7 June, 1996 as 50-50 percent joint venture.

Capital Market Development Committee led by Union Minister for Finance and Revenue was formed on 1 July, 2008 and six subcommittees were formed to support the committee. Then, three-step capital market road map was adopted in accordance with the norms of international and ASEAN communities.

Domestic Bond Development Subcommittee has introduced two-year government bonds in addition to three-year and five-year government bonds beginning 1 January, 2010 and K-10 million bond in addition to K 10-thousand and K 100-Thousand and K 1-million bonds.

Corporate Companies Development Subcommittee has been taking actions for development of corporate companies. Securities rules and regulations formulation subcommittee is drafting securities exchange and dealing bill for development of capital market.

Training and Education Subcommittee is conducting local and foreign courses and workshops for capital market development and production of professionals. On addition, the Central Bank of Myanmar signed MoU with Tokyo Stock Exchange and Daiwa Research on 29 May, 2012.

Accounts and Audit Norms Subcommittee is holding talks for application of Myanmar accounting standards in line with international regulations. The Central Bank of Myanmar has shifted from fixed exchange rate to controlled floating exchange rate since 1 April, 2012. Money exchanger licenses have been issued to 17 private banks. Foreign Currency dealer work permits have been issued to 11 private banks on 25 November, 2011 and account transfer was allowed on 9 February, 2012.

It has been allowed for use of ATM at financial organizations in Myanmar. Banks are providing such services as card system payment for small amount of

money and cheque system payment for large sum of money. Securities exchange and dealing bill has been put forward to the Hluttaw.

Proposed Hluttaw representative U Thein Win said he did not withdraw the proposal and wished to hear the decision of the Hluttaw. As most MPs voted in favour of the proposal, it was approved.

U Than Swe of Taninthayi Region Constituency No (2) put forward a proposal **urging the Union government to take the bones of deceased King Thibaw and the Queen from Ratnagiri of India back to Myanmar.** A Hluttaw representative seconded the proposal.

The Hluttaw approved to discuss the proposal and announced that Hluttaw representatives wishing to discuss the proposal could register at the break.

U Nu of Yangon Region Constituency No. 10

submitted a proposal **urging the Union government to review the grading system of matriculation exam and to set the basic pass marks higher to be able to turn out increased number of qualified ones and to introduce a system in which those who fail the exam can re-sit for the particular subject he failed within short period.** A Hluttaw representative seconded the proposal.

The Hluttaw approved to discuss the proposal and announced that the Hluttaw representatives wishing to discuss the proposal are register when the session ended.

Troubled Cal nuke plant maps comeback

LOS ANGELES, 31 July—The operator of California's troubled San Onofre nuclear power plant estimates that the damaged twin reactors could be running by the end of the year.

Documents obtained by *The Associated Press* on Monday show Southern California Edison notified the Public Utilities Commission last week that the Unit 2 reactor could possibly be back in service by 18 Nov, and its sister Unit 3 by 31 Dec.

An Edison spokeswoman says the dates submitted to state power managers for planning could be changed.

The plant has been sidelined since January after a tube break in a steam generator released traces of radiation.

The dates do not represent a formal request to restart either reactor, which must be submitted to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission. Edison says safety is its first concern.

Serbian president, Italian FM against “new conditions”

BELGRADE, 31 July—Italian FM Giulio Terzi underlined in the talks with Serbian President Tomislav Nikolic that Italy supports Serbia's efforts to join the EU.

During their meeting on Monday in Belgrade, he added that Italy was ready to offer all the necessary help in the continuation of the dialogue with the interim government in Pristina, the Serbian Presidency said in a press release.

The Italian foreign minister, who is the first foreign official to visit Belgrade after the government formation, expressed Italy's readiness to cooperate especially in the energy sector, and informed President Nikolic that Italy is

willing to invest funds in joint projects with Serbia such as construction of hydroelectric power plants on the Ibar River and the Drina River, the statement added.

Nikolic “expressed gratitude for the two countries’ strategic partnership, and the investments which Italy has made in Serbia so far, stressing that Serbia counts on Italy’s support on its further EU pathway”.

Nikolic and Terzi “agreed that it would be very bad for all if the EU presented additional preconditions for Serbia's EU accession”, the statement said.

Nikolic voiced Serbia's readiness to implement the recommendations put forward by the European Union, and correct the omissions in the judicial reform, the fight against corruption and crime, and

dubious privatizations.

Commenting on the issue of Kosovo and Metohija, President Nikolic underlined that in the future, Serbia's policy will be transparent, when it comes to its southern province.

Serbia will insist that the maximum security and peace be provided for all citizens in the province, and will not accept the independence of that party of Serbia, Nikolic stressed.

The plan is to reach a national consensus on the issue of Kosovo and Metohija, so that the strategy be backed by all relevant actors, Nikolic said.

The Serbian president told his guest that to date, the problem in the dialogue with Pristina lay in the fact that Serbia's representatives had not asked for anything, but just made concessions on Serbia's behalf.—Internet

Typhoon Saola is approaching eastern Taiwan

BEIJING, 31 July—At 6:00 am today, typhoon Saola was centered about 410 km southeast of Hualian, Taiwan province with maximum wind force up to scale 12 near its centre.

Saola is forecasted to move north by west at speed of 5-10 km per hour with gaining intensity approaching eastern Taiwan gradually.

Affected by the typhoon, in the next 24 hours from 8:00 am today, there will be gale with force scale up to 8-10 affecting east of Taiwan. Maximum wind force will occur up to scale 11-14 and gust up to 15-16 near its centre. And high wind with scale 7-8 and gust up to scale 9-11 is forecasted to happen in Bashi Channel, Balintang Channel, Taiwan Straits, eastern and southern South China Sea, southern East China Sea, Taiwan coast, and coastal Fujian. Taiwan will be hit by heavy rain or rainstorm and isolated severe rainstorm.

At the same time, the 10th tropical storm Damrey has increased into a severe tropical storm in this morning. At 5:00 am today it was centered about 860 km south by east of Tokyo, Japan with maximum wind force up to scale 10. It is forecasted to move west by north at speed of 30 km per hour with gaining intensity. In the coming 24 hours it will not affect off shore of China.—Xinhua

Bilateral trade between Russia, Vietnam surging in 2012

MOSCOW, 31 July—Trade volume between Russia and Vietnam would rise by 1 billion US dollars to 4 billion dollars in 2012, said Russian economist Elvira Nabiullina Monday. While addressing a Russia-Vietnam business conference in Moscow, Nabiullina, who was appointed as President Vladimir Putin's economic

advisor in May, said bilateral trade turnover between the two countries has risen three-fold since 2006.

The two-way trade between Russia and Vietnam was 1.5 billion dollars in the first five months of the year, said Nabiullina, who insisted both Russia and Vietnam still need to tap their potentials in trade.

further expand their economic and trade cooperation.

To achieve the goal, both Moscow and Hanoi have been considering a free-trade agreement between Vietnam and the tripartite Customs Union comprising Russia, Belarus and Kazakhstan, Nabiullina said.

Vietnamese President Sang said Sunday his country is interested in joining the Customs Union, which became fully operational on 1 July, 2010.—Xinhua

Illicit drugs worth 524 mln USD seized in Sydney

SYDNEY, 31 July—The Australian Federal Police (AFP) and Australian Customs and Border Protection Service have smashed an international drug syndicate, seizing 558 kilograms of illicit drugs in Sydney, the AFP said on Tuesday.

The illicit drugs including 306 kilograms of crystal methamphetamine, known as

ice, and 252 kilograms of heroin, with a street value of 500 million AU dollars (524.6 million US dollars), were seized during a major joint operation with the Australian Customs and Border Protection Service in Sydney on Monday, the AFP said.

“This is the largest seizure of ice in AFP history and is also the AFP's third largest seizure of heroin,” the AFP

said in a statement on Tuesday.

The AFP arrested four foreign nationals from Hong Kong as well as three Australia based syndicate members in Sydney central business district and Western Sydney during Monday's operation.

All seven alleged offenders are expected to appear in Sydney Central Local Court on Tuesday, the AFP said.—Xinhua

Flood leaves 88 dead, 62,900 homeless in DPRK

PYONGYANG, 31 July—Floods triggered by recent downpours have left 88 people dead, 134 injured and more than 62,900 homeless in the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, the official KCNA news agency reported Saturday.

KCNA reported that more than 5,000 houses were destroyed and nearly 12,030 others were submerged in the

floodwater. In addition, about 200 areas of embankment extending 160 kilometres and 4,800 hectares of cropland were washed away while more than 25,700 hectares were submerged.

The KCNA reported that officials across the country were visiting flood-stricken

Two dead, 26 missing in Xinjiang mudslide

URUMQI, 31 July—Two people died and 26 others have been reported missing after a mudslide hit northwest China's Xinjiang Uygur autonomous region Tuesday morning, the local govern-

ment said. The mudslide occurred at an iron ore mine in the township of Araltobe, Xinyuan county, Kazak Autonomous Prefecture of Ili, said a spokesman with the prefecture's fire brigade,

adding that the brigade received an emergency call at around 1 am.

The mud and debris buried 28 people, initially identified as 22 mine workers and six local residents, said

the spokesman. The bodies of two victims have been recovered from the debris, which covers an area about 500 metres long, 60 metres wide and five to six metres deep, he said. More than 50 rescuers are searching for the missing people.—Xinhua

Vermillion ovarian cancer test shows positive result

NEW YORK, 31 July—Diagnostics company Vermillion Inc said a clinical trial of its blood test for detecting ovarian cancer showed the test had a high chance of correctly identifying patients with cancer. Shares of the company jumped 21 percent to \$2.17 on the news. The study, named OVA1, is a blood test for pre-surgical assessment of ovarian tumors for malignancy.

The study focused on two particularly challenging subgroups - women with early-stage ovarian cancer and pre-menopausal women. "A key goal of the study was to investigate the challenging pre-menopausal setting, where benign cysts have a high incidence and early-stage cancer often goes undetected," Chief Executive Gail Page said.

The test had a 94 percent sensitivity in the pre-menopausal group, and a 91 percent sensitivity in the early-stage ovarian cancer group.—Reuters

Capri scooter spill leaves ex-French PM in Rome hospital

ROME, 31 July—Former French Prime Minister Francois Fillon underwent treatment for a broken foot in a Rome hospital on Monday after falling from a scooter at the weekend while on holiday on the picturesque Italian island of Capri.

Fillon, favourite to become leader of former President Nicolas Sarkozy's conservative UMP party, was flown by helicopter on Sunday to Rome's Villa Stuart, which specialises in orthopaedic surgery and sports medicine, after the accident.

The 58-year-old trapped his foot under his scooter after skidding and falling over, sources close to Fillon

told Reuters.

Hospital officials said he was in good condition after being operated on by doctors Pierpaolo Mariani and Attilio Santucci, the same surgeons who treated Roma soccer star Francesco Totti and French footballer Philippe Mexes.

"He will be able to continue his political campaign, although all will depend on what the doctors say," sources close to Fillon said. He would return to France in the next few days.

A hospital spokesman said Fillon was visited on Monday by Ferrari Chairman Luca di Montezemolo, with whom sportscar fan Fillon had been holidaying when the accident occurred.—Reuters

Pakistan to push for intelligence sharing at US talks

DUBAI, 31 July—Pakistan's spy chief will call for an end to US military drone strikes in its tribal areas bordering Afghanistan and push for a sharing of technology and intelligence during a visit to Washington this week, the country's interior minister said on Monday.

But indications are that Islamabad's demands for a halt to drone attacks may receive a less-than-sympathetic hearing from top Obama administration officials.

Pakistani Lieutenant-General Zaheerul-Islam's visit to meet CIA director General David Petraeus will be his first since he became head of the Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) in March and follows a thaw in relations between Pakistan and the United States.

Pakistan, however, continues to insist that US drone strikes—which it says are a breach of its territorial sovereignty—must end.

"We will push for no drones. If we (Pakistan and the US) are partners, we should sit together and have a common strategy. However, in this regional war there has been no common strategy

against a common enemy," Interior Minister Rehman Malik told a news conference in Dubai.

"I hope the visit of the director of the ISI will have good results. There is some dialogue going on as we speak," he said.

The United States has given no sign it is willing to halt the drone strikes.

In fact, US officials signal there will be little, if any, change in US counter-terrorism activity in Pakistan

and the region.

"Let's not lose sight of the issue here. Al-Qaeda and its militant allies are violating Pakistan's sovereignty by using its territory to plot and carry out attacks," a US official said.

"Aggressive counterterrorism operations are what's frustrating al-Qaeda and pushing their leadership to the brink."

The official, who spoke on condition of anonymity, also reiterated US concerns about the extent of Pakistan

efforts to confront militants—including the Haqqani network and the Pakistani Taliban, known as the TTP—in loosely-governed tribal areas along the country's mountainous border with Afghanistan.

"Everyone wants the Pakistanis to accept more responsibility for taking on al-Qaeda, TTP and the Haqqanis.

The problem is they have yet to show the capability—or willingness—to take effective action" in Pakistan's tribal areas, said the US official.

The official added that while there was "always room for dialogue on how to defeat terrorist entities in the region," Pakistani authorities "need to offer some concrete ideas on how it does more against the violent Haqqanis, rather than point fingers."

But Pakistan's Malik told journalists: "Both countries have to find a midway (point). This of course means intelligence-sharing. Also, give us the technology and we will use it."

The US has given us F-16 (fighter jets). Are we misusing it?"

Malik gave no further details, but Pakistan has long asked the United States to provide its military with its own drones for use in its tribal areas.—Reuters

World Bank says rising food prices a concern, ready to help

WASHINGTON, 31 July—The World Bank on Monday said it stood ready to help governments respond to a broad-based run-up in grain prices that has again put the world's poorest people at risk and could have lingering detrimental impacts for years.

"We cannot allow short-term food-price spikes to have damaging long-term consequences for the world's most poor and vulnerable," World Bank Group President Jim Yong Kim said in statement.

"The World Bank and our partners are monitoring this situation closely so we can help governments put policies in place to help people better cope," said Kim, a public health expert facing his biggest challenge in two months on the job.

A severe drought in the US Midwest has cut projected grain yields dramatically, reviving memories of 2008 when a sharp increase in food prices caused riots in some countries and raised questions about the use of crops to make biofuels.

Wheat prices have jumped more than 50 percent and corn prices more than 45 percent since mid-June, with dry conditions in Russia, Ukraine and Kazakhstan, excessively wet weather in Europe and a below average start to the Indian monsoon season adding to global crop worries. Prices for soybeans, a critical food and animal feed crop, also have risen almost 30 percent over the past two months and nearly 60 percent since the end of last year.

Mother delivers twins on two highways

A New York mother gave birth to twin boys on two different highways before making it to the hospital, officials said.

Siobhan and Bryan Anderson were making their way to North Shore University Hospital in Manhasset around 7 a.m. on 28 July after Siobhan's water broke, *Newsday*, Melville, NY, reported.

Siobhan's contractions intensified on the road and she asked Bryan to pull over on the Southern State Parkway, the report said.

"I'm going to deliver," she told him.

Bryan called 911 and state trooper Ron Ferraro arrived along with Nassau County police and medical technicians.

As medical technicians put Siobhan on a stretcher and were wheeling her to the ambulance, she gave birth to Gavin John.

The mother "literally delivered the baby on the stretcher on the road, with cars going by," said Nassau Officer Ron Gerlin.

Siobhan was then moved into the ambulance which began making its way to the

nearest hospital, which was about 10 miles away.

However, when Siobhan couldn't hold back the second twin, the ambulance pulled off the Wantagh State Parkway to deliver Declan Michael.

"I was crying because it was so painful and I had no painkillers," Siobhan said. "They really wanted to come out." Minutes later, the ambulance arrived at the Nassau University Medical Center, where the babies were brought into the delivery unit by officers.

"They were moving around, looking at the world. I thought it was beautiful," said Leila Ayers, a nurse in the unit.

Super-Robot with twin guns is unveiled

Cuba's Bermoy Acosta, 25, had also looked impressive on her way to the final, comfortably beating Belgium's Ilse Heylen, 35, who won bronze in Athens in 2004, in the semis.—Reuters

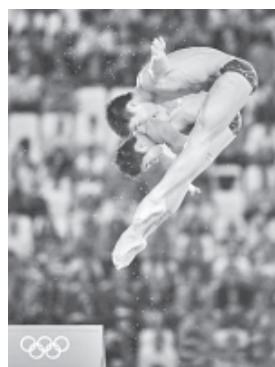

China extends dominance at gymnastics men's team

LONDON, 31 July—Chinese gymnasts cleared doubts that followed their sixth-place finish in the preliminary, winning the Olympic men's team gold in a dominant fashion on Monday.

The Chinese pulled off a nearly perfect performance to garner 275.997 points, beating Japan's by 4.045 points.

Japan, initially placed in fourth place, picked the silver medal after winning an appeal against the pommel horse

score on Kohei Uchimura. Host gymnasts dropped from second to third for bronze, Britain's first team gymnastics medal for a century.

China made a series of mistakes in the qualifying, but did nothing wrong in the final, which drew media suspicions that the defending champions had hidden their strength.

China ranked sixth in the qualifying and Japan fifth, making the two arch rivals in the same rotation in the final. Japan, silver medalists in

Beijing, started their challenge from rings, which earned 0.8 points ahead of China. In the second rotation of vault, China gained their lead once for all as all three gymnasts completed the discipline before Japan.

Japan's Koji Yamamuro banged on his knees and arms on his landing and had to be carried off by team medical staff. China overtook Japan by 1.542 points after the vault rotation and never looked back.

Shemyakina wins gold in women's epee

LONDON, 31 July—Ukraine's Yana Shemyakina caused an upset by winning gold in the women's individual epee with a nail-biting 9-8 extra-time victory over defending champion Britta Heidemann of Germany at the London Olympics on

Monday. Twelfth seed Shemyakina, who was 18th at the Beijing Games four years ago, worked her way through the preliminaries here with two key victories over top-ranked Romanian fencers.

She beat fifth seed Ana Maria Branza and then

Kazakh Chinshanlo wins women's 53kg gold

LONDON, 31 July—Kazakhstan's Zulfira Chinshanlo won her country's second gold medal of the London Olympics with a world record in the women's 53 kilogram weightlifting on Sunday. Chinshanlo set a world record for the clean and jerk - the second of two styles of lift - at 131 kg which, when added to her 95 kg in the snatch, gave her a winning total of 226 kg.

That was enough to see off stiff competition from Taipei's Hsu Shu-Ching who lifted a total of 219kg, while the bronze medal went to Cristina Iovu of Moldova who tied with Hsu on 219kg but was placed third because her bodyweight was higher.

Earlier, China's hopes of continuing their dominance in the women's weightlifting events were dashed when 17 year-old medal hope Zhou Jun crashed out of the 53 kg class group B session without completing a single lift.

North Korean lifts 3 times body weight for gold

LONDON, 31 July—It was a big record for a little guy. North Korea's Om Yun Chol, all of 5 feet and 123 pounds, won a gold medal by confidently lifting an Olympic record 370 pounds in the clean and jerk Sunday at the London Games. That was more than three times his body weight, something only a handful of others have ever done.

How unlikely was the upset victory?

Om was in the "B" group with lower-ranked competitors and lifted weights of 160 and 165 kilograms on his first two attempts early in the day. He got the crowd roaring when it was announced he would go for 168 kilograms - the Olympic record. "I wanted to lift a big weight and make the other athletes nervous," Om said.

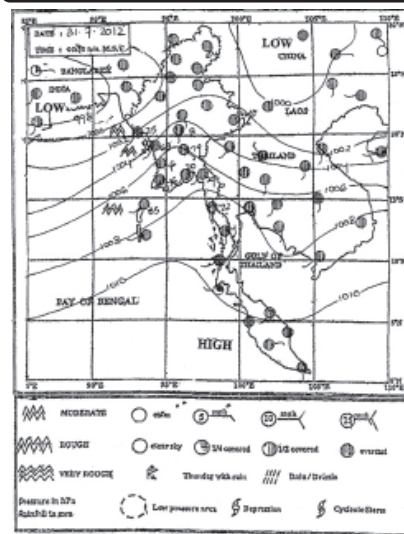
It worked.

As the "A" group entered the platform later Sunday, double world champion and pre-competition favorite Wu Jiangbiao of China lifted 133 kilograms in the snatch to gain an 8-kilogram lead over Om. But Wu's 156-kilogram clean and jerk wasn't enough to beat the North Korean's total of 293 kilograms, and he had to settle for the silver. European champion Valentin Hristov of Azerbaijan got the bronze.

Om's successful lift broke the mark of 167 kilograms set by Halil Mutlu of Turkey in Sydney in 2000.—Internet

Narang wins India's first medal at 2012 Olympics

LONDON, 31 July—Gagan Narang won the bronze medal for India in the 10-m air rifle event at the London Olympics 2012 with Romania's Alin George Moldoveanu winning gold and Italy's Niccolo Campriani winning silver.

Ace marksman Gagan Narang on Monday opened India's account in the London Olympic Games by clinching the bronze medal in the men's 10m air rifle event here.

Narang shot 103.1 in a gripping ten-shot finals for an aggregate of 701.1 after scoring 598 in the qualifying round in which also he stood third. The gold was won by Romania's Moldoveanu

Alin George who tallied 702.1, that included 103.1 in the final, to upset world number 1 Niccolo Campriani of Italy who stood second with 701.5 at the Royal Artillery Barracks.

After a good start when he shot 10.7, Narang was off target with his second shot that fetched him 9.7. But he gathered his wits and steadied his aim to collect 10.6 10.7 10.4 and 10.6 in the following four shots to at one stage remain on course for bagging even a silver.

However, he slipped a bit and had to fight for the bronze medal with China's Wang Tao who finished fourth with 700.4.—Internet

Ye blazes into semi-finals of 200 meters medley

LONDON, 31 July—China's Ye Shiwen showed that her world record display in the women's 400 meters medley was no flash in the pan when she clocked the fastest time in the heats for the 200 metres event on Monday morning.

The 16-year-old was over a second and a half ahead of the second fastest qualifier as she once again showed her power in the breaststroke and freestyle. Ye finished ahead of Zimbabwe's Kirsty Coventry and American swimmer Caitlin Leverenz while another Chinese swimmer Li Xiaoxing also got through to the last 16.

"I am very satisfied and a little bit surprised by my result," commented Ye after her race. Elsewhere, Michael Phelps took a small step towards convincing doubters that he is still capable of winning medals in the London Olympics, when he cruised into the semi-finals

of the men's 200 meters butterfly on Monday morning.

The American followed his excellent swim in the second leg of the men's 4 x 100 meters freestyle relay final on Sunday with a comfortable swim to qualify for the semi-finals with the fifth fastest time.

Austrian Dinko Juric qualified with the fastest time, while two Chinese

swimmers Wu Peng and Chen Yin, who both swam in the same heat, both made it through to the last 16.

Chen will be optimistic of taking a medal after finishing fourth in the World Championships in Shanghai last year, while Juric will hope to improve on his World Championship display, after clocking the fastest time in the heats before failing to get near the medal positions.—Xinhua

Weightlifting: North Korea claim more gold

LONDON, 31 July—North Korea maintained their 100 percent men's weightlifting record at the London Games thanks to a sensational performance by Kim Un Guk who claimed a gold medal and a world record in the men's 62 kg class.

Despite a gold for Chinese women's lifter Li Xueying in the 58kg class the country's mixed run, in a sport they totally

dominated in Beijing, was compounded by a disappointing fourth place for men's world champion Zhang Jie.

Zhang also lost his 2008 world record when Kim notched up a total of 327 kg across the two styles of Olympic lift, adding one kg to the world's best and matching the highest lift for the individual snatch style.

Kim, 23, took to the weightlifting platform with a small bow in front of the barbell, but left the stage leaping and punching the air to a standing ovation after comfortably seeing off a field packed with medal contenders.—Reuters
