

THE COURTS (EMERGENCY PROVISIONS)
(REPEAL) ACT, 1947.

[BURMA ACT No. II OF 1947.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal the Courts (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1943 ;

AND WHEREAS by Proclamation, dated the tenth day of December, 1942, the Governor of Burma has assumed to himself all powers vested by or under the Government of Burma Act, 1935, in the Legislature or in either Chamber thereof ;

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the said powers, it is hereby enacted by the Governor of Burma as follows :—

1. (1) This Act may be called the Courts (Emergency Provisions) (Repeal) Act, 1947.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

2. The Courts (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1943, as subsequently amended, is hereby repealed.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in section 2, the provisions of section 7 of the Courts (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1943, shall continue and be deemed to be in force up to and until the 31st day of March, 1947, as if this Act had not been enacted.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in section 2, the provisions of clause (j) of section 14 of the Courts (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1943, shall continue and be deemed to be in force for a period of ~~two~~ ^{three} months from the commencement of this Act, as if this Act had not been enacted. xx/

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in section 2, the provisions of clause (n) of section 14 of the Courts (Emergency Provisions) Act, 1943, shall continue and be deemed to be in force up to and until the 30th June 1947, as if this Act had not been enacted.
