

THE CURRENCY AND COINAGE (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1947.

[BURMA ACT NO. XVII OF 1947.]

[5th April 1947.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Currency and Coinage Act, 1946 ; Burma XLV,  
1946.

AND WHEREAS by Proclamation, dated the tenth day of December, 1942, the Governor of Burma has assumed to himself all powers vested by or under the Government of Burma Act, 1935, in the Legislature or in either Chamber thereof ;

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the said powers, it is hereby enacted by the Governor of Burma as follows :—

1. This Act may be called the Currency and Coinage (Amendment) Act, 1947.  
Short title.

2. Until a date to be fixed by the Governor in this behalf the provisions of section 15, sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 16, and sub-sections (1) and (2) of section 20 of the Currency and Coinage Act, 1946, shall have effect as if the words "Currency Notes" were substituted by the words "India Notes overprinted with the inscription 'Military Administration of Burma, Legal Tender in Burma only'."
