

THE COURTS (EMERGENCY PROVISIONS)
(REPEAL) (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1947.

[BURMA ACT NO. XX OF 1947.]

[5th April 1947.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Courts (Emergency Provisions) (Repeal) Act, 1947;

AND WHEREAS by Proclamation, dated the tenth day of December, 1942, the Governor of Burma has assumed to himself all powers vested by or under the Government of Burma Act, 1935, in the Legislature or in either Chamber thereof;

Now, THEREFORE, in exercise of the said powers, it is hereby enacted by the Governor of Burma as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be called the Courts (Emergency Provisions) (Repeal) (Amendment) Act, 1947.

(2) It shall be deemed to have come into force with effect from the 14th day of January, 1947.

2. In section 4 of the Courts (Emergency Provisions) (Repeal) Act, 1947, for the words "two months" the words "three months" shall be substituted.
