

THE IMPORTS AND EXPORTS CONTROL ACT, 1947.

[BURMA ACT No. XXXIX OF 1947.]

[1st August 1947.]

It is hereby enacted as follows.—

1. This Act shall come into force on the first day of August, 1947.
2. The Notifications of the Commerce and Supply Department issued in exercise of the powers conferred by Rule 84 of the Defence of Burma Rules, being No. 13, dated 16th March 1946, and No. 15, dated 14th February 1947, as amended and in force on 31st July 1947, shall be deemed to be validly made and continued in force as prohibitions or restrictions under section 19 of the Sea Customs Act.
3. All proceedings pending and liabilities existing on 31st July 1947 under either of the said Notifications by virtue of the said Rule may be continued and shall be enforceable under the Sea Customs Act as if the said Notifications had been validly issued under section 19 of the said Act.
4. For the purposes of this Act, the Sea Customs Act shall be construed as if the word "land" in section 19 included air and as if the word "may" were substituted for the word "shall" in section 183; and the Land Customs Act shall be construed as applicable also to the import and export of goods by air and as if sections 19 and 19A were included in the Schedule of that Act.
