

THE REGISTRATION (TEMPORARY PROVISIONS)
(AMENDMENT) ACT, 1947.

[BURMA ACT No. LXVIII of 1947.]

It is hereby enacted as follows :— [22nd November 1947.]

1. At the end of clause (a) of section 3 of the Registration (Temporary Provisions) Act, 1947, hereinafter referred to as the said Act, the following shall be inserted :—

“ and on payment of such penalty or fine, if presented for registration beyond the four months after the termination of the emergency period : ”

2. For section 4 of the said Act the following shall be substituted :—

“ 4. The following documents may, if desired, be tendered to be placed on record in the manner to be prescribed by the Governor in cases where the official Register Books concerned are found to have been lost or destroyed in consequence of the war :—

- (i) documents in original already registered under the Act,
- (ii) registered counterparts or duplicate signed copies of such documents, and
- (iii) certified copies of documents, which were already registered either before or during the emergency period, but the originals or registered duplicates of which were subsequently lost.”
