

FACTORIES (AMENDMENT) ACT, 1950.

[Act No. 1 of 1950.]

1. This Act may be called the Factories (Amendment) Act, 1950.
2. (1) It shall come into force on such date as the President may, by notification, appoint in that behalf.
(2) It shall extend to the whole of Union of Burma.
3. Section 2 (f) shall be reworded as follows:—

“factory” means any premises including the precincts thereof whereon ten or more workers are working, or were working on any day of the preceding twelve months, and in any part of which a manufacturing process is being carried on with the aid of power or is ordinarily so carried on and also includes such premises whereon twenty or more workers are working, or were working on any day of the preceding twelve months, and in any part of which a manufacturing process is being carried on without the aid of power or is ordinarily so carried on, provided that this does not include a mine subject to the operation of the Mines Act, 1923;
