Ninth regular session of Second Pyithu Hluttaw holds 17th-day meeting

THE 17th-day meeting of the ninth regular session of the Second Pyithu Hluttaw held at the Pyithu Hluttaw meeting hall of the Hluttaw Building in Nay Pyi Taw yesterday.

No additional staff for sub health dept. yet

U Sai Saing Mai of Mongkai constituency raised a question on whether additional staff member will be supplied to the Sanha and Mongyun sub-rural health centres in Mongkai Township, whether sufficient staff residences will be constructed, and whether special priority will be given for health centre buildings to be constructed in line with proper construction standards.

Deputy Minister for Health and Sports Dr. Mya Lay Sein replied that there are no plans for supplying additional medical staff at the moment but it will be prioritized in 2019. In addition, once the Sanha and Mongyun

health centres acquire property deeds, funds for constructing the buildings in line with set standards will be included in the yearly budget proposals, said the deputy minister.

Dental association open to negotiations over overflow drains

U Shwe Hla (a) U Shwe Hla Win of Thingangyun constituency raised a question on whether

the overflow drains in the three wards fenced off by the Myanmar Dental Association will be nationalized to improve drainage.

Deputy Minister Dr. Mya Lay Sein replied that the Myanmar Dental Association is an independent non-governmental organization and thus the Ministry of Health and Sports has not directed authority over it. However, the MDA is ready to

discuss and negotiate with MPs and other departmental and relevant officials concerning the matter, said the deputy minister. She suggested that the Yangon Region government, the city development committee, regional MPs, local elders and the MDA should meet together to discuss the matter.

Q&A session

Firstly, Pyithu Hluttaw Hluttaw's Rights Committee Secretary Dr. Hla Moe answered to U Maung Myint of Mingin constituency's question on whether the time limit for having the floor asking questions and tabling motions will be altered from 5 minutes to 6 minutes, and whether the time limit for discussing motions tabled will be altered from 6 minutes to 5 minutes.

Next, Union Minister for Labour, Immigration and Population U Thein Swe replied a question from U Aung Thaung

Shwe of Buthidaung constituency asking whether any course of action will be taken towards the head of the immigration department in Buthidaung Township for abusing his power to receive bribes in the national registration card process.

Similarly, Deputy Minister for Health and Sports Dr. Mya Lay Sein replied (1) a question raised by U Kyaw Min of Kamayut constituency asking whether the university football field in Ward 9 of Kamayut Township will be reopened, (2) a question by U Aung Soe Min of Ywangan constituency asking whether the Myaing station hospital on the Hanmyintmoh-Ywangan-Aungpan highway in Ywangan Township will be upgraded, and (3) a question by U Sai San Thein of Mongnai constituency asking whether a spectator stand for the Mongnai Township football field will be constructed.

Second Amyotha Hluttaw's ninth regular session holds 17th-day meeting

UNION-LEVEL officials reply to questions on land use, rock extraction, drug abuse, education

During the 17th-day meeting of the ninth regular session of the Second Amyotha Hluttaw held at the Amyotha Hluttaw meeting hall of the Hluttaw Building in Nay Pyi Taw yesterday, asterisk-marked questions were answered, a report read and a bill approved.

Local residents in Hmawby approved for housing

U Pe Chit of Yangon Region constituency 9 raised a question asking whether any solutions can be found for the issues faced by U Thein Aye and the 55 households concerning the 140 acres of land in Baygone Ohnchan, Padtan Village-tract, Hmawby Township in the Northern Yangon District.

Deputy Minister for Home Affairs Maj-Gen Aung Thu replied that his ministry has already approved that 40 acres of the land is used for housing by U Thein Aye and the 55 households, after a field inspection from the Hmawby General Administration Department confirmed 40 acres are used for housing while

the rest are used for farming. In addition, the rural farmland administration group only opened a lawsuit, in accordance with protocol, to revoke the grazing land status of the 40 acres used for housing. He said the ministry is working to ensure the Yangon Region General Administration Department can officially approve of this, in accordance with Section 68 of the Land and Revenue Act.

Illegal stone extractions will be prosecuted

U Khin Win of Magway Region constituency 2 raised a question asking whether any

measures will be taken to regulate the unrestricted extraction of stone from parts of the Ayeyawady River flowing near Pakokku, Chauk, Yenangyoung, and Sinbaungwe townships in Magway Region.

Deputy Minister Maj-Gen Aung Thu replied that the extraction projects conducted in the country are carefully documented to be in accordance with the law, and any violation will be handled with according to the law as well.

Remedying drug abuse with rehab, policy

U Tun Tun Oo of Mandalay Region constituency 2 raised a

question asking whether there are any strategic plans to combat the proliferation of cheap and illegal Yaba stimulant tablets throughout the country.

Deputy Minister Maj-Gen Aung Thu replied that a new drug policy has been implemented to not only eradicate drugs, but also to provide healing, rehabilitation, and alternative development or business opportunities to people. He said students and young people are being warned about the consequences of drug abuse through education programs, pamphlets, news and media outlets, and other educational programs throughout the Nay Pyi Taw Council and states and regions. He said the Anti-Narcotics Task Force and the Drug Activity Special Complaint Department are both contributing towards drug eradication. He added that international cooperation, research and implementation of the drug policy are being carried out to tackle this issue.

Procedures for ensuring optimal education

Naw Chris Tun (a) Dr. Arkar Moe from Kayin State constituency 7 raised a question asking what procedures and

techniques are used in forming school administration associations, determining school operations, appointing and promoting faculty in vocational institutes.

Union Minister for Education Dr. Myo Thein Gyi replied that an independent committee was formed consisting of various professors on 6 April 2018, in accordance with Section 27 of the National Education Law to consult colleges and universities in designing and implementing agreements relevant to their institutions, as well as their institutions' development.

He said they are encouraging the formation of student councils and other associations to steer the development of institutions and ensure a bright future for students, while the appointing and promoting of teaching staff and faculty is carried out in accordance with the Civil Services Personnel Law and bylaws.

Similarly, Union Minister Dr. Myo Thein Gyi and Deputy Minister for Construction U Kyaw Lin answered to questions raised by U Htay Oo of Yangon Region constituency 2 and U Zon Hle Htan of Chin State constituency 4.

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Reports, motions discussed, approved

The Pyithu Hluttaw then proceeded to either read, discuss, or approve reports submitted and motions tabled.

Firstly, U Soe Thura Tun, Chairman of the Pyithu Hluttaw Natural Resources and Environmental Conservation Committee, read the committee's report and the Speaker called for MPs interested in discussing the report to enroll their names.

Secondly, U Khin Maung Than, Secretary of the Pyithu Hluttaw Public Accounts Committee, submitted the committee's report to receive approval from the Hluttaw. The Hluttaw proceeded to approve the report.

Thirdly, U Pe Than of

Myebon constituency discussed the report from the Pyithu Hluttaw's Hluttaw Rights Committee and committee secretary Dr. Hla Moe responded to the discussion.

Fourthly, U Thaung Htay Lin of Patheingyi constituency tabled a motion for the Hluttaw Rights Committee's report and the Hluttaw proceeded to approve the motion.

Fifthly, Dr. Wai Phyto Aung, member of the Pyithu Hluttaw Bill Committee, tabled a motion to amend to the Health and Occupational Safety Bill submitted by the Ministry of Labour, Immigration and Population. The Hluttaw proceeded to approve the motion.

Sixthly, Bill Committee member U Wai Hlaing tabled a motion for the Pyithu Hluttaw to approve the amendments

to the Bill making second amendments to the Labour Dispute Settlement Law. The Hluttaw proceeded to approve the motion.

Seventhly, U Nay Myo Tun, member of the Pyithu Hluttaw Bill Committee, and U Tin Ko Ko Oo of Bilin constituency tabled a motion for the Pyithu Hluttaw to approve the amendments to the 2018 Gambling Bill submitted by the Pyithu Hluttaw Public Affairs Management Committee. After some deliberation, the Hluttaw proceeded to approve the motion.

MPs discuss combating illegal trade

Afterwards, U Myo Zaw Aung of Kawlin constituency tabled a motion urging the Union Government to formulate a master strategic plan to

combat the illegal trade practices that are critically damaging the nation's economic development. The motion was discussed by U Lone Jone San Mai of Sumprabum constituency, Daw Ni Ni May Myint of Taungup constituency, U Soe Aung Naing of Kyonpyaw constituency, U Myint Han Tun of Budalin constituency, U Tin Htwe of Waw constituency, U Win Myint Oo (a) U Nay Myo of Nyaungshwe constituency, U Kan Myint of Thayet constituency, U Ohn Khin of Pulaw constituency, and Daw Cho Cho Win of Mawlaik constituency.

U Ohn Khin of Pulaw constituency discussed that the production of high-quality end products should be promoted, otherwise illegal trade will enter the country one way or another. He called

for monitoring of quality assurance and tax levying, using reasoning and enforcing rule of law in economic practices.

Daw Cho Cho Win of Mawlaik constituency discussed that a variety of regional products in the country are a target of illegal trade and called for the rules and regulations and policies to be scrutinized. She said poor enforcement of the rule of law engenders corruption, and the yearly trade deficit increase is contributed by the unequal ration of high imports to low exports from the country. She said the entire country needs to rally together to combat illegal trade practices.

Following, Deputy Minister for Planning and Finance U Maung Maung Win explained that the key ministries related to

illegal trade are the Ministry of Commerce, the Ministry of Planning and Finance and the Ministry of Home Affairs, with the other ministries sharing indirect relevance. He said the Myanmar Police Force, under the Ministry of Home Affairs, inspects imports and exports for illegal trade and acts in accordance with The Essential Supplies and Services Law, The Export and Import Law and other existing laws. He said the Customs Department, Department of Trade, Internal Revenue Department, Department of Forestry, and the Road Transport Administration Department all collaborate together to conduct joint investigations in border trade camps and along trade routes, in the quest to combat illegal trade. — Min Min Zaw ■

Notification on Use of the Myanmar Companies Online (MyCO) Registry and the Myanmar Companies Law 2017

1. The Myanmar Companies Law 2017 came into effect on 1 August 2018 and the Myanmar Companies Online (MyCO) registry has been established to support its implementation (www.myco.dica.gov.mm). The Myanmar Companies Online (MyCO) registry permits the electronic registration of companies in accordance with the Myanmar Companies Law 2017 and provides reliable and up-to-date information on all registered companies.
2. Under the new MyCO registry, a company will receive an electronic receipt of any documents submitted to the Registrar and no other documents will be issued. The MyCO registry contains information on companies which can be easily searched by the public. Detailed company information will also be available for purchase on the MyCO registry shortly. All forms and applications used under the previous law, for example, Shareholding Details (Form 6), Directors List (Form 26), Annual Return (Form E), can no longer be used under the Myanmar Companies Law 2017.
3. Government ministries have been informed of the key changes in the Myanmar Companies Law 2017 and changes to the procedures in a briefing on 3 July 2018. By the letter of the Ministry of Planning and Finance dated 10 August 2018 (Ref MOPF-1/3/35(6596/2018), concerned ministries and agencies have been notified of these changes and provided with User ID and passwords to enable them to obtain company information on the MyCO registry.
4. Accordingly, companies are informed that old forms specified in paragraph 2 above are no longer required to be submitted to Government departments, banks and other organisations and where necessary, company registration certificates can be used for company activities and company information can be found on the MyCO registry.
