## Past week proves deadly for Taliban as over 70 militants killed in Afghanistan

KABUL, 19 Oct—The past week has proved deadly for Taliban militants in Afghanistan as over 70 of the outfit's fighters including some commanders have been killed. In the latest wave of conflicts with security forces, six Taliban fighters were killed as they came in contact with troops in Badghis Province of northern Afghanistan on Sunday afternoon.

"Taliban rebels attacked a convoy of NATO-led forces on the road leading to provincial capital Qalai Now today at 03:00 pm local time (1030 GMT) and troops returned fire killing six militants including their commander Mullah Abdul Hakim," military spokesman in the region Abdul Basir Ghorri told *Xinhua*.

On Saturday eight militants were killed during a joint operation of Afghan and NATO troops in the southern Uruzgan province while three others had been arrested on the same day in the northern Baghlan Province.—*Xinhua*

## Indian Air Force clears US army plane detained at Mumbai

NEW DELHI, 19 Oct—The Indian Air Force has cleared a chartered US military plane which was detained at the Mumbai airport on Sunday morning by the Indian authorities for failing to correctly identify itself, said Defence Ministry sources.

The plane took off about 14:30 pm after being given green light by the Air Force and having its procedural formalities completed, said the sources.

The chartered *Boeing*

767, which belonged to the North American airlines, was carrying 205 passengers including some US marine commandos from Fujairah, the United Arab Emirates to Bangkok, Thailand.

After the Air Traffic Control (ATC) found a discrepancy in its call sign, it was asked to immediately land while flying over the Indian airspace around at 08:00 am (02:30 GMT).—*Xinhua*

## Police taser 19-year-old man, who dies

SAN BERNARDINO, 19 Oct—A San Bernardino, Calif, man died on Sunday morning after police used a stun gun to control him as they pulled him away from an altercation, officials said.

The 19-year-old man, whose name

has not yet been released, became combative during the fight at a San Bernardino board and care facility, the *Los Angeles Times* reported.

Paramedics responded within minutes to attend to the man, who experienced difficulty breathing. He was taken to a hospital and died about an hour later, police said.

## At least five killed in car bombing in Baghdad

BAGHDAD, 19 Oct—At least five people were killed and 15 others injured in a car bomb explosion in Baghdad northern neighbourhood of Adhamiyah on Sunday, an Interior Ministry source said.

The incident took place in the evening when a booby-trapped car parked near a play station shop which use to be crowded with children and young men at this time, the source told *Xinhua* on condition of anonymity.

Ambulances and civilian cars transported the victims to nearby hospitals, while Iraqi security forces cordoned off the areas to secure the scene, the source said.—*Xinhua*

## Rising seas threaten Shanghai, other major cities

SHANGHAI, 19 Oct—This city of 20 million rose from the sea and grew into a modern showcase, with skyscrapers piercing the clouds, atop tidal flats fed by the mighty Yangtze River.

Now Shanghai's future depends on finding ways to prevent the same waters from reclaiming it.

Global warming and melting glaciers and polar ice sheets are raising sea levels worldwide, leaving tens of millions of people in coastal areas and on low-

lying islands vulnerable to flooding and other weather-related catastrophes.

Shanghai, altitude roughly 3 meters (10 feet) above sea level, is among dozens of great world cities — including London, Miami, New York, New Orleans, Mumbai, Cairo, Amsterdam and Tokyo — threatened by sea levels that now are rising twice as fast as projected just a few years ago, expanding from warmth and meltwater. Estimates of the scale and tim-

ing vary, but Stefan Rahmstorf, a respected expert at Germany's Potsdam Institute, expects a 1-metre (3-foot) rise in this century and up to 5 meters (15 feet) over the next 300 years.

Chinese cities are among the largest and most threatened. Their huge populations — the Yangtze River Delta region alone has about 80 million people — and their rapid growth into giant industrial, financial and shipping centres could mean massive losses from rising sea levels, experts say.

The sea is steadily advancing on Shanghai, tainting its freshwater supplies as it turns coastal land and groundwater salty, slowing drainage of the area's heavily polluted flood basin and eating away at the precious delta soils that form the city's foundations.

## US soldier killed in S Afghanistan

KABUL, 19 Oct—Continued militancy in Afghanistan's troubled southern region the hotbed of Taliban militants claimed the life of an American soldier on Sunday, a Press release of NATO-led International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) said.

"One US service member was killed in an improvised explosive device (IED) attack in southern Afghanistan, on 18 October," the short Press release added.

However, it did not give more details or the exact place of the incident.

Kandahar the birthplace of Taliban and the neighbouring Zabul, Helmand and Uruzgan commonly known as the hotbed of Taliban has been the scene of increasing insurgency since the collapse of Taliban regime eight years ago.

It has been proved the deadliest year of 2009 for both foreign troops and innocent civilians in the war-plagued country as conflicts and violence have so far claimed over 415 international troops, including 247 from America, and 1,500 civilians.

## ASEM promotes overall Asia-Europe ties

KUALA LUMPUR, 19 Oct—The Asia-Europe Meeting (ASEM) has been working to promote the overall Asia-Europe relations on international and inter-regional issues of common interest, said an official with the European Commission (EC) here on Monday.

Vincent Piket, head of the EC delegation to Malaysia, made the remarks at a seminar in the framework of the ASEM to discuss a new Asia economic model beyond the global crisis.

Piket said that dialogue in ASEM was a valuable complement to the bilateral relations between the Asian countries and the EU, thanks to its open and inclusive character and the diversity among its shareholders.—Xinhua

## Oil jumps above \$79 in Asia to 2009 high

SINGAPORE, 19 Oct—Oil prices jumped above \$79 a barrel to a 2009 high on Monday in Asia as investors looked to the corporate earnings of big US retailers this week for signs the consumer may be regaining confidence.

Benchmark crude for November delivery rose as much as 52 cents to \$79.05 a barrel but later fell back and was up 24 cents at \$78.77 by midday Singapore time in electronic trading on the New York Mercantile Exchange. The contract added 95 cents to settle at \$78.53 on Friday.

Last week, crude broke out of a five-month trading range between \$65 and \$75 a barrel on a weakening US dollar and expectations that oil demand will eventually recover as the global economy grows next year.

Investors will be eyeing third quarter results from retailers this week for clues about the strength of the US consumer. Apple Inc, McDonald's Corp, appliance maker Whirlpool Corp and toy maker Hasbro Inc are among those reporting this week.—Internet

## Microsoft hopeful technology will spur growth

DUBAI, 19 Oct—A top Microsoft official expressed hope on Sunday that technology will spur economic growth around the world as the US software giant launches its latest operating system.

"There was an economic upset. It's had an impact around the world," Steven Guggenheimer

told a Dubai technology conference, adding he has been repeatedly asked whether the Windows 7 operating system would fare well amid the economic downturn.

"As an industry, we are focused on innovation and the work we do impacts society... we all have hope that things will continue

to move forward and that technology will continue to spur growth," he said.

Guggenheimer, who is charged with worldwide sales, marketing and licensing of pre-installed Windows systems, said there were one billion people using computers, so the impact would resonate.—Internet

# Indonesia plays down US dumping accusation

JAKARTA, 19 Oct—Indonesia has no concern over the US allegation of subsidies and dumping concerning Indonesia's coated paper products, saying that the US making up the accusation, local media reported on Monday.

Indonesian Trade Ministry's director general for international trade cooperation Gusmardi Bustami was quoted by the

*Jakarta Post* as saying that the government was to respond on the accusation.

Last Thursday, the US government announced it would initiate an investigation into allegations by US firms and unions.

"We'll be ready when they send their questionnaires. We'll be cooperative and will surely present all the data required," he said.

"The Finance Ministry and the Forestry Ministry (which are also involved in the allegations), among others, will (respond) too," Bustami added.

## Earnings blitz to test market's mettle

NEW YORK, 19 Oct—US stocks could slip this week if the spate of earnings from bellwethers including Apple Inc (AAPL.O) and Caterpillar Inc (CAT.N) do not live up to heightened expectations.

After a 60 percent run-up in the stock market since March and the Dow again eclipsing 10,000, investors believe the market is priced to perfection. So if earnings fail to hold up their end, stocks could come under pressure.

"We've had a tremendous rally," said Eric Kuby, chief investment officer at NorthStar Investment Management Corp in Chicago.

"As we get into some of the little, bumpier earnings releases you're going to have some headline risk and a little bit of selling pressure."

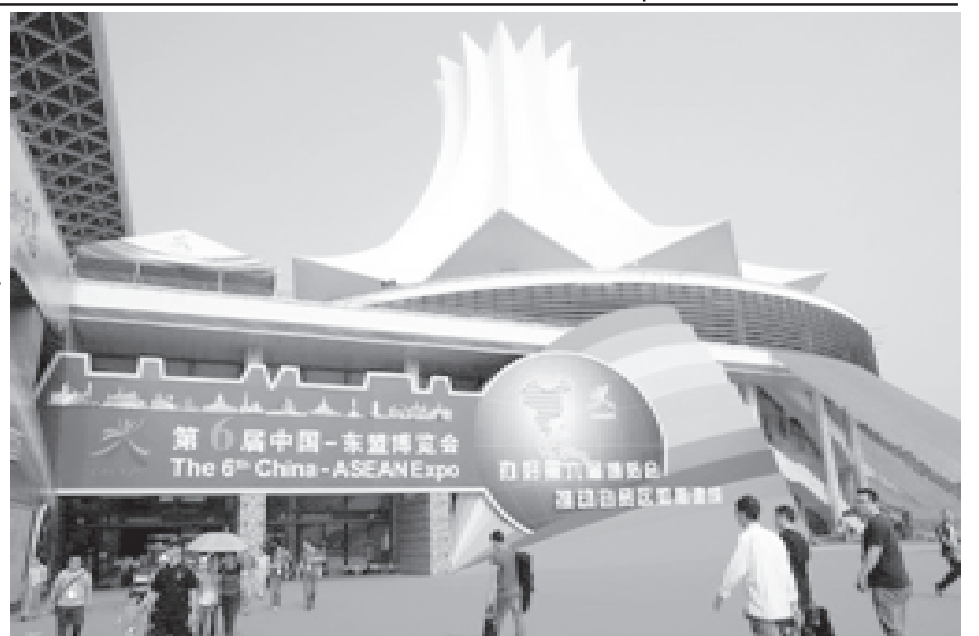
## Vietnam to sign export rice contracts with Philippines for 2010

HANOI, 19 Oct—Vietnamese rice exporters will sign export contracts with the Philippines for the year 2010, the local newspaper *Liberty Saigon* reported on Monday.

According to Vietnam's Ministry of Agriculture and Rural Development, the to-be-signed rice volume to be exported to the Philippines for 2010 will be 250,000 tons of rice. The contract

signing is expected to be at the end of this month, two months earlier than usual. The Philippine move to intensify rice procurement to boost its stockpile and assure food

security amid the recent calamities will make the price of Vietnamese white rice 25 percent broken increase in the international market, said local rice traders.—Xinhua

## China's Antarctic expedition crosses equator

ABOARD XUELONG, 19 Oct—China's Xuelong (Snow Dragon) vessel, on the country's 26<sup>th</sup> Antarctic expedition, on Monday crossed the equator and entered the southern hemisphere on their journey to Antarctic.

The expedition team organized a tug-of-war competition which is a traditional activity for navigators to celebrate the special moment together.

On Sunday morning,

the Snow Dragon successfully avoided a tropical storm which had already developed into typhoon Lupit. And now she is navigating smoothly in the doldrums.

After nine days navigating in the southern Pacific Ocean, it is expected to arrive on 28 Oct at New Zealand's Christchurch port, its first supply port.

"We will take bunkering and freshwater during our stay in the harbor and

will be bound for the Great Wall Station of China in the southwestern Antarctic region three days later," said Wang Jianzhong, captain of the Snow Dragon.

The expedition team sailed from Shanghai on 11 Oct. A total of 251 scientists, workers and logistics staff joined the team for the half-year-long research expedition on the icebreaker.

## S Korea, Russia to jointly review cause of satellite launch failure

SEOUL, 19 Oct—South Korean and Russian officials will meet to determine causes of a failure in sending a satellite, carried by a jointly developed space rocket, into the target orbit in August, according to local media. The failure review board will meet in Moscow on 29 Oct, the Ministry of Education, Science and Technology said on Monday.

South Korea launched its first space rocket, the Korea Space Launch Vehicle-1 (KSLV-1), on 25 Aug, but the satellite failed to enter its target orbit after successfully separating from its carrier rocket.

Local media reported that during the 10-minute flight, the space rocket underwent brisk two-step separations, and the satellite it carried also ignited and got off the second stage as planned. However, the satellite separation was made 36 km higher than its target altitude.

Experts later found that one of the two firings did not separate from the top of the second stage rocket after launching from South Korea's Naro Space Centre.

## Singapore teachers, trainers happiest

SINGAPORE, 19 Oct—A job portal poll in Singapore found that teachers and trainers are the happiest, local media reported on Monday.

An online poll of 5,460 working adults conducted by Jobs Central, a local job network portal, asked respondents across Singapore how satisfied they were with various aspects of their jobs to produce an overall "happiness" score, local newspaper the *Straits Times* reported.

The score had 100 signifying "very happy" and 50 as "neutral."

Employees in education and training emerged the

happiest of all, with a score of 59.8, followed closely by those in public relations who scored 58.8.

Individuals who work to ensure companies comply with regulations seem to be the least happy with their jobs, with an average of only 52.9.

The survey also found that employees working for the government are happier than those in the private sector.—Xinhua

## Eight major ports closed due to bad weather in Mexico

MEXICO CITY, 19 Oct—Fierce cold winds and high sea waves have triggered the closures of Mexico's eight major ports, including oil ports on the Atlantic Ocean, Mexican Communication and Transportation Ministry said in a statement on Sunday.

Earlier on Sunday, oil ports of Coatzacoalcas, Cayo Arcas, Frontera, Isla del Carmen, and Dos Bocas were closed, which was followed by the closures of the commercial ports of Tampico, Altamira and Tuxpan.

Authorities have issued a warning at the Atlantic region. Meanwhile, the country is also suffering a hurricane on its Pacific coast.—Xinhua

## Vietnam confirms one more death of A/H1N1 influenza

HANOI, 19 Oct—Vietnam confirmed that a 29-year-old woman in central province of Binh Dinh died of A/H1N1 influenza, raising the total number of flu deaths in the country to 24, said a daily report on the website of the Ministry of Health on Monday.

The woman was 39 weeks pregnant. She was admitted to the Bong Son Hospital of Binh Dinh on 10 Oct with fever, coughing and difficulty in breathing. Doctors conducted an operation to save the baby as her conditions deteriorated.

## Brazil vows safe Olympics after 14 killed in Rio

RIO DE JANEIRO, 19 Oct—At least 2,000 police officers patrolled this coastal city on Sunday and Brazilian officials pledged to host a violence-free 2016 Olympics despite bloody drug gang shootouts that left 14 people dead.

An hourslong firefight between rival gangs Saturday in one of the city's slums killed at least 12 people, injured six and saw a police helicopter shot down and eight buses set on fire.

Police said on Sunday that they killed two other suspected drug traffickers in overnight clashes near

the Morro dos Macacos ("Monkey Hill") slum where the gangs fought for territory a day earlier. But the area was largely peaceful.

Two officers died and four were injured Saturday when bullets from the gang battle ripped into their helicopter hovering overhead, forcing it into a fiery crash landing on a soccer field. Officials said they did not know if the gangs targeted the helicopter or it was hit by stray bullets.—*Internet*

## Two aid workers kidnapped in Darfur set free after 107 days

KHARTOUM, 19 Oct—Two female staff of Irish aid agency GOAL who were kidnapped at gunpoint in Sudan's Darfur region in July were celebrating their release on Sunday from more than 100 days in captivity.

Irishwoman Sharon Commins, 33, and Ugandan Hilda Kawuki, 42, were kidnapped in the North Darfur town of Kutum on 3 July by a gang of armed men from a compound run by GOAL.

The two women were freed early on Sunday after local tribal chiefs pressured the kidnappers into releasing them, a Sudanese minister said.

## Philippine emergency teams prepare as typhoon nears

MANILA, 19 Oct—The Philippines deployed emergency teams across flooded and landslide-hit areas in northern regions of the main Luzon island on Monday as a powerful typhoon moved closer, weeks after two storms killed more than 850 people.

Lupit, a category 4 typhoon packing centre winds of 175 kph (108 mph) and gusts of up to 210 kph, was expected to hit land on Thursday.

It was hovering at 1,160 km (720 miles) east of the northern Cagayan province on Monday, said weather bureau chief Prisco Nilo.

Soldiers, police officers and civilian emergency teams have been positioned for possible rescue and relief operations, said Lieutenant-Colonel Ernesto Torres, spokesman for the national disaster agency.—*Internet*

## Japanese FM urges US not to use nuclear weapons first

TOKYO, 19 Oct—Japanese Foreign Minister Katsuya Okada on Sunday called on the United States to make a pledge not to use nuclear weapons first, local media reported on Monday.

Okada made the remarks in a speech in Kyodo on Sunday afternoon when the International Commission on Nuclear Nonproliferation and Disarmament (ICNND) opened the fourth session in Hiroshima, the first city struck by an atomic bomb in 1945. Criticizing the Japanese government's inconsistent stance on the issue, Okada said: "It is very debatable whether there is a discrepancy for (the Japanese government) to argue strongly, on the one hand, for the elimination of nuclear weapons while also saying to please use nuclear weapons as a first strike for Japan."—*Internet*

## Singapore creates world's first semi-cloned fish

A research team from the National University of Singapore (NUS) said that they have created the world's first semi-cloned fish, local media.

According to local radio 938live, the fertile female medaka fish named Holly, was created with the semi-cloning genetic approach, which uses a new and unpredictable combination of genetic traits from both parents similar to normal fertilization. The radio said that Holly has gone on to produce many normal offspring that carry a genetic marker identical to hers and her parents.

Researchers at the NUS said that this indicates that the technique retains genetic stability hence providing a powerful tool for transmission of genetic information to the offspring—similar to normal reproduction, adding that their findings have important implications for reproductive medicine and technology like for treatment of male infertility.

## Macao woman swindled out of \$38,000 in lottery scam

A 35-year-old woman in Macao has been deceived into paying the swindlers some 300,000 patacas (38,000 US dollars) in an e-mail lottery scam, the *Macao Post Daily* reported on Friday.

The woman received an e-mail claiming that she had won one million

US dollars in a lottery overseas, and she was told to pay service charges and taxes before she could get her winnings, the daily quoted a spokesman of Macao's Judiciary Police as saying.

The woman later paid the 300,000 patacas in three installments to the swindlers, the spokesman said.

## Man, 81, finishes race after borrowing a catheter

Organizers of the Twin Cities Marathon said they won't disqualify an 81-year-old runner who won his age group after using a borrowed catheter.

Jerry Johncock of Shelbyville, Mich, was sidelined at an aid station about 21 miles into on Sunday's race because a blood clot prevented him from urinating.

The aid station had no catheter, but a spectator stepped forward to offer Johncock a catheter he had in his car.

Aides helped insert the catheter and Johncock went on to finish in a little over 5 hours 22 minutes. Race officials considered disqualifying Johncock because of a rule against improper assistance. But executive director Virginia Brophy Achman said they decided Johncock didn't break the rule.

She called Johncock "a great role model and example of what you can do as a runner."

We news crew together with Chairman of Pakokku Township PDC U Tin Myo Latt and Secretary U Win Tint made fields trip to farmlands. It was about two miles' drive from Pakokku-Myaing motor road. Just as we arrived there, we saw thriving and lush paddy fields.

We interviewed a farmer. He said, "My name is U Win Maung. I am at the age of 60. Farming is my traditional livelihood. I live in Gwaygyo village and have a field of three acres. I grow Shwe Myanmar and Hsinnweyin

paddy strains in the rainy season and summer. Sesame, pigeon pea, green gram and corn are grown as mixed crops. Thanks to the dam we no longer need to depend on rain water."

cultural purpose. So, it is not convenient for growing paddy and only other crops could be grown in the past. Paddy can be grown two times a year. Myanmar Agriculture Service disseminates cultivation methods to farmers. Everything is smooth now." Different methods are being applied to sup-

ply irrigation water to farmlands." We witnessed that local people enjoying better socio-economic life by growing monsoon paddy and summer paddy as well as other crops such as pea, sesame and corn.

## Millions of net users hit by scareware

BEIJING, 19 Oct—Despite continued warnings in the media and by anti-virus software firms, millions of Internet users are falling victim to scams that leave them open to hacking and identity theft, Internet security firm Symantec said this week. In particular more than 40 million Internet users have in the last year fallen victim to criminals targeting them with fake security software.

Symantec says such downloads are not only harmful but allow criminals to obtain the victim's credit card details or other private information. The firm has identified 250 versions of what it terms "scareware" which may earn criminals more than 1.2 million U.S. dollars every year.

The fake software is often distributed through

the use of pop-up advertisements which are deliberately designed to look legitimate, using the same typefaces as Microsoft and other well-known software providers. Falsely warning that a computer's security has been compromised, Internet users are duped into downloading the software for a fee of around 100 dollars.

## China enterprises index 1.54% higher

HONG KONG, 19 Oct—The Hang Seng China Enterprises Index on the Hong Kong Stock Exchange rose 196.27 points, or 1.54 percent, to close Monday's trading at 12,947.27.

The H-shares index, initiated in August 1994 and readjusted on 17 Sept, 2009, tracks the overall performance of 44 major Chinese mainland state-owned enterprises listed on the Hong Kong Stock Exchange.

The Hang Seng China H-Financials Index went up 244.05 points, or 1.40 percent, to close at 17,696.50.

The H-Financials

Index, initiated on Nov. 27, 2006, readjusted on 10 Sept, 2007, tracks the performance of nine major banks and insurers of the Chinese mainland.

The Hang Seng Mainland Composite Index gained 69.44 points, or 1.73 percent, to close at 4,083.37.

Introduced on 13 Oct, 2001 with the latest readjustment effective on 9 March, 2009, the Hang Seng Mainland Composite Index gauges the performance of 132 Hong Kong-listed companies with principal places of business in Hong Kong and the Chinese mainland.

## OPEC weekly oil price reaches highest point of this year

VIENNA, 19 Oct—The weekly average oil price of the Organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) reached 72.21 U.S. dollars per barrel last week, the highest point of this year, OPEC said on Monday.

After hovering for six weeks, OPEC weekly average oil price exceeded 70 dollars to 72.21 dollars. In addition, it also registered the largest

weekly increase, which was up 4.33 dollars compared to the previous week, since the end of March.

The OPEC oil price has been increasing for seven consecutive days since Oct. 8, which was very rare in oil prices movement.

In the last trading day last week, the one-day rise even reached 1.69 dollars, which also set the highest record of OPEC daily oil price this year.

Since the world economy has begun to resume, the expectation of growing demand for crude oil continued to push the international oil price.

The US Federal Reserve's newly released figures showed that, after increasing for two consecutive months, the U.S. industrial production increased again by 0.7 percent in September compared to the previous month.

## Israeli central bank governor hails China's developments since opening up

JERUSALEM, 19 Oct—China's developments during the past 60 years, especially after its reform and opening up 30 years ago were unprecedented and "absolutely amazing," Israel's central bank governor said.

"There hasn't been a sustained growth of this speed for so many people ever," Bank of Israel Governor Stanley Fischer said in an exclusive interview with *Xinhua*. "There are countries in East Asia that grow very rapidly, like (South) Korea for instance, but the scale of what happened in China is different from what happened anywhere at any previous time in the history," he said. The inter-

nationally renowned central banker said China's unprecedented growth since its opening up to the world over 30 years ago is not only reflected in the economic numbers, but also "in the streets," "in the way people are dressed," and "in the buildings." During his

first visit to China in 1988, Fischer said when driving from the airport "on a bad road" at night, he saw "trucks broken down that were parked in the middle of the road. It looked like very much a developing country, not a very rich developing country."—*Xinhua*

## HK airport traffic registers mild drop in September

HONG KONG, 19 Oct—Hong Kong International Airport saw mild year-on-year drops in passenger volume, cargo throughput and air traffic movements in September, airport authority said on Sunday. Passenger volume at the airport fell 3.5 percent to 3.5 million in September, while cargo throughput and air traffic movements fell 4.3 percent to 304,000 tons and 8 percent to 22,570.

Authority Chief Executive Officer Stanley Hui said the mild year-on-year cuts in passenger and cargo traffic showed

that contractions continued to narrow.

One passenger and six freighter airlines had resumed or started operating at the airport since July, reflecting well on their confidence in Hong Kong and the aviation industry, said Hui.

Travel made by Hong Kong residents recorded 9 percent growth. Exports and transshipment saw declines of 4 percent and 15 percent, while imports grew 6 percent. Drops in air traffic volumes continued to narrow in the last three months.

## Drug makers, CVS slammed for promos

INDIANAPOLIS, 19 Oct—Some US physicians say promotional mailings by CVS Caremark pharmacies on behalf of drug makers that resemble vital patient information are misleading.

The mailings to doctors, marked "Confidential — May Include Protected Health Information," are promotions for Eli Lilly & Co, Merck, AstraZeneca, Bayer and other pharmaceutical companies, *The Indianapolis Star* reported on Sunday.

The newspaper said ethicists, privacy groups and consumer advocates have complained, saying the mailings are misleading.

Consumers Union, the non-profit group that publishes Consumer Reports magazine, has claimed the promotional mailings increase the chances doctors will prescribe inappropriate pharmaceuticals.

## Magnitude-5.2 quake rocks Mindoro, Manila

MANILA, 19 Oct—A magnitude-5.2 quake in the Mindoro area rocked Metro Manila and parts of Southern Luzon on Monday morning, local media reported. Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (Phivolcs) said that the quake occurred at 7:50 am. It said that no damage was expected from the tremor, but aftershocks are likely.

Citing initial reports reaching him, seismologists from Phivolcs said the quake was felt at Intensity III in Metro Manila, but they advised the public to remain calm. Meanwhile, the United States Geological Service data showed that the quake was at magnitude 5.7, with the epicenter traced to 44 km west of Batangas, or 70 km northwest of Calapan, Mindoro; or 103 km south-southwest from Manila.—*Xinhua*

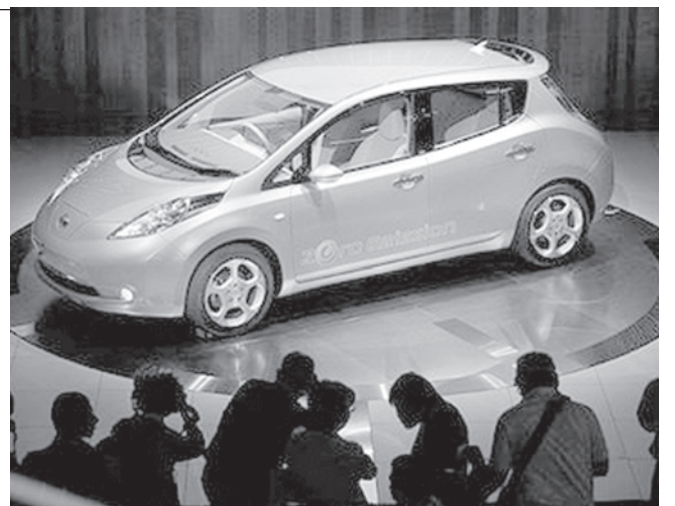
## Moderate quake strikes Sumatra, Indonesia

JAKARTA, 19 Oct—An earthquake measuring 5.2 on Richter scale jolted North Sumatra, in western Indonesia on Monday, with no reports of damage or casualties, the Meteorology and Geophysics Agency said. The quake occurred at 06:29 am Jakarta time (2329 GMT) with epicenter at 80 km southwest Tanahbala of North Sumatra and at 16 km in depth, the agency reported.

Indonesia has been frequently hit by strong quakes recently, such as the 6.4 magnitude quake in West Java on Friday, following the 7.3 and 7.6 magnitude quakes in the area and West Sumatra respectively. Indonesia is laid on a vulnerable quake-hit zone called the "Pacific Ring of Fire," where two continental plates, stretching from Western hemisphere to Japan, meet that often cause seismic and volcanic movements.—*Xinhua*

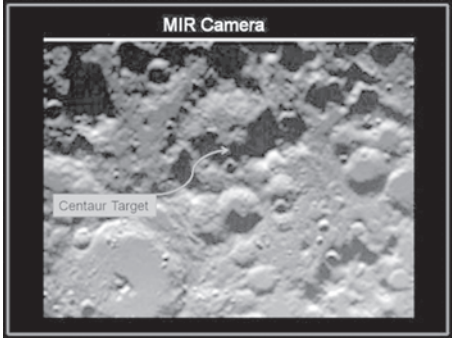






## Moon strike not total waste of time

BEIJING, 19 Oct — One week after the impact of the LCROSS probe, NASA scientists have finally found a debris plume created by the impact in the data, proving their moon strike

worthwhile after all.

New images show a mile-high plume of lunar debris from the probe's target

crater, named Cabeus, shortly after the space agency's Centaur rocket struck on 9 Oct.

The debris plume was captured by the LCROSS ultraviolet/visible and near infrared spectrometer. Its signature was faint, but distinct.

Before the impact, many observers told the media that they were disappointed because of the lack of spectacle. But scientists said the mission was carried out for "a scientific purpose, not to put on a fireworks display for the public." Now that the plume was found, scientists hope that the analysis of it will show signs of water ice ejected from the Cabeus crater.

The magnitude, form, and visibility of the debris plume offer more information about the concentrations and state of the material at the impact site.

However, Michio Kaku, a professor at the City College of New York, said that beautiful pictures captured are not worth 79 million US dollars. "To be a spectacular success, we had to find large quantities of underground ice."

## Vermont willow harvest promises cheap biomass fuel

MIDDLEBURY, 19 Oct —Middlebury College used to heat its buildings with oil, then switched to wood chips. Now it has planted a sustainable and relatively cheap fuel source — willow shrubs — that could help cut demand on the state's forests. With a nine-acre patch of the fast-growing willows, the college is conducting a biomass energy experiment that seeks to answer the question: What if wood chip-burning heat systems lead to the deforestation of Vermont?

Willows, which grow faster than other trees and branch out when pruned, may be the answer — and may be a resource for other cold-weather states, too. So Jack Byrne, director of sustainability for the college, and business services director Tom Corbin have turned into farmers of sorts, planting tightly packed rows of willows in a field west of Middlebury's campus.

The question of biomass fuel supply has taken on new urgency for the college since last winter, when the exclusive liberal arts school opened a new boiler sys-

tem that heats about 100 campus buildings, running turbines that meet about a fifth of the college's electrical demand.

The system, in a glass-fronted building in the middle of campus, runs on a "gasifier," heating wood chips and extracting carbon monoxide and other gases that are then burned in the boiler.

"We use our buildings to teach as much as we can," Byrne said. "We wanted students to be aware that when they turn up a thermostat, there's a connection to a tree getting cut down."

population and family planning, put more funds into the reproductive health and family planning programme, intensify the capability building of developing countries and take concrete actions to enhance cooperation in these fields.

China has been seriously honoring its commitments to the millenary aims set by the International Conference on Population and Development, said Chen, who is also president of the All-China Women's Federation. —Xinhua

## Tooth DNA may help ID 4,000-year-old mummy

BOSTON, 19 Oct — A tooth containing valuable DNA information was extracted from the head of a 4,000-year-old mummy's head, scientists in Boston said.

The mummy's head was among artifacts collected when a tomb near Cairo was excavated in 1915. It is part of "The Secrets of Tomb 10A: Egypt 2000 BC," an exhibit that opened on Sunday at the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston, *The Boston Globe* reported.

The team performing the operation consisted of doctors from Massachusetts General Hospital and conservation specialists from the museum, the newspaper said.

Information gleaned from the tooth might reveal the identity of the ancient Egyptian from whose disembodied head it came. —Internet

## China's first exploration vessel for combustible ice delivered for use

GUANGZHOU, 19 Oct — China's first deep-sea exploration vessel for the reconnaissance of combustible ice was delivered for use on Sunday in south China's Guangdong Province.

Wang Xuelong, deputy director of China Geological Survey Bureau, handed over the certificate of seaworthiness for the ship coded Ocean No 6 to the Guangzhou Marine Geological Survey Bureau, which is carrying out the combustible ice survey in South China Sea.

Wang said that the ship independently developed by China cost 400 million yuan (59 million US dollars) to build. The ship has a gross tonnage of 4,600 tons and an endurance of 15,000 nautical miles. It has been equipped with underwater remote-control survey facilities and other high-tech devices, he said. —Xinhua

## Weightlifting teenagers show potential at Chinese National Games

JINAN, 19 Oct—Two teenagers caused media hype in the women's weightlifting competition as they both overcame veterans to win gold medals at the 11th Chinese National Games on Sunday. Guan Xinlei of Jiangsu, 19, hoisted a winning lift 147kg in her final attempt, seven kilos more than her fifth lift, to knock down defending champion Ouyang Xiaofang to win the 63kg division gold medal with a world-record breaking total result of 265kg.

In an earlier match, Li Xueying, at the same age with Guan, beat two world champions Qiu Hongmei and Sun Caiyan to win the women's 58kg division, regarded as one of the young hopefuls for the London Olympics. "Guan seldom lifted 147kg in the training, so she is really amazing today. It is very rare that a lifter can produce her best result in an fierce competition," said Cao Xinmin, Guan's coach.

Ouyang of Liaoning, world champion in 2006, produced the same result as Guan but had to settle with the silver medal due to the bodyweight disadvantage. The 19-year-old Guan's jerk and total results were five kilos and eight kilos more than the world records of jerk and total respectively. —Xinhua

## PSG suffer another French title setback

PARIS, 19 Oct—Paris St Germain suffered another setback to their French first division title hopes on Sunday when they slumped to a dispiriting 1-0 defeat at Toulouse. The loss left PSG in ninth place in the table, seven points behind leaders Lyon. It also meant that they have not won a league game since 29 August.

Albin Ebondo scored the game's only goal in the 74th minute as Toulouse moved three points clear of the drop zone. A double from Spanish-Brazilian midfielder Nene handed Monaco a 2-0 win over Lens and allowed the Principality side to reclaim fourth spot from Marseille. Nene put himself top of the French league goalscorers list following a performance which underlines both his and his club's ambitions this term.

He fired in his sixth goal of the sea-

son after ten minutes and Monaco could have gone two-up before the break following a corner from Nene but Vedran Runje saved a fine header from Adriano. After the break Monaco were happy to sit back on their advantage with the odd foray forward. —Internet

WIGAN, 19 Oct—Mark Hughes believes Manchester City's impressive start to the season proves the Premier League's big-four are no longer invincible. 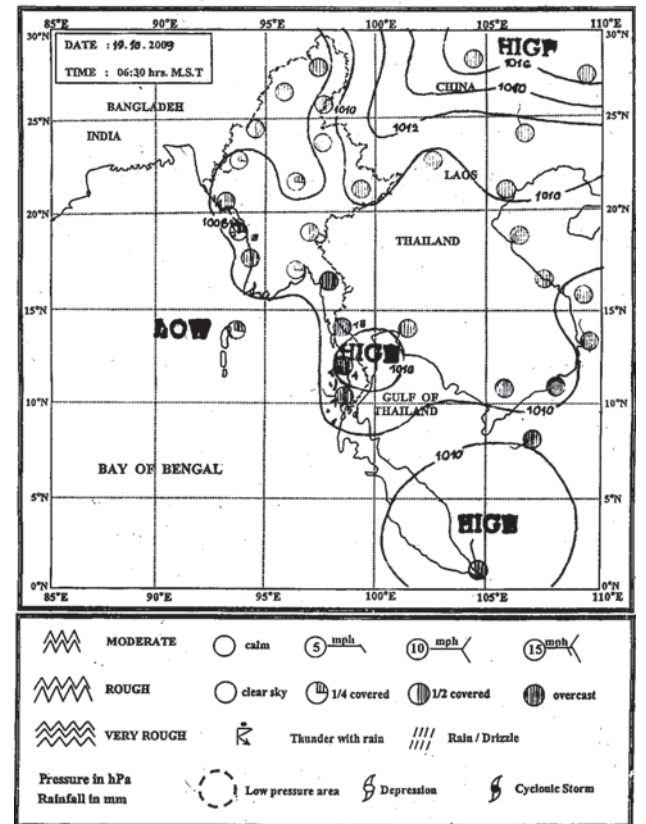

## Gwaygyo Dam benefits farmland in arid zone

Yesagyo Township of Pakokku District in Magway Division is situated in central Myanmar. Being an arid region, it has about average rainfall of 26 inches annually. The Head of State gave guidance on construction of dams by damming up creeks for greening and food sufficiency of the region.

The Minister for Agriculture and Irrigation carried out the instructions given by the Prime Minister on 12 August 2005 on implementations of the remaining dam and reservoir projects as quickly as possible during his tour of Pakokku District. No.3 Construc-

tion of Irrigation Department launched the construction of Gwaygyo Dam in September 2006. On 19 August 2007, it was successfully inaugurated.

Up to August 2009, 71 dams and lakes have been built in Pakokku District. On 13 September, Myanma Alin daily news crew paid a visit to Gwaygyo Dam that irrigates 400 acres of farmland in order to observe how dams benefit local people.

Gwaygyo dam was built by damming Sinmawin creek about two furlongs to the west of Gwaycho
