

Five questions answered, one proposal submitted, informing Hluttaw, submitting important proposal carried out

Nay Pyi Taw, 26 Oct - The seventh day session of Pyithu Hluttaw session took place at Pyithu Hluttaw Hall of Hluttaw Building, here, this morning, attended by Pyithu Hluttaw Speaker Thura U Shwe Mann and 359 representatives.

Deputy Minister for Finance and Revenue U Maung Maung Thein and Deputy Minister for Health Dr Daw Thein Thein Htay answered the queries raised by five representatives separately.

In the session of submitting the proposal, Union Minister U Soe Maung replied the proposal of urging the Union Government to issue orders and directives for auspicious days of the States to be set as gazette holidays by the State governments submitted by U Gun Moun of Haka Constituency that there is no plan to extend more gazette holidays and the proposal should be put on record. While seeking the approval of the Hluttaw, it was announced to discuss.

In informing the Hluttaw, the Pyithu Hluttaw received the Bill for exchange and trading of securities sent by Amyotha Hluttaw with its approval. In the session of submitting an important proposal, U Mann Maung Maung Nyan of Pantanaw Constituency submitted a proposal urging the Union Government to make quick response to townships where conflicts are ongoing and which are vulnerable to violence by increasing the number of security forces and level of security for ensuring rule of law and tranquility and decisions in accord with the law on matters with regard to violation of law and human rights, and eight representatives took part in discussions.

Union Minister for Home Affairs Lt-Gen Ko Ko replied that the proposal was an appropriate one in accord with the present time. The proposal was approved to put on record by the Hluttaw.

The meeting came to an end at 2 pm. The eight-day session of the Hluttaw will be held on 1 November.
