Settlement on land issues reported at Pyidaungsu Hluttaw

NAY PYI TAW, 25 Sept cancelled. Union level officials reported on settlements on land confiscation issues recommended by the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw at the Pyidaungsu Hluttaw session on Thursday.

Deputy Minister for Industry U Thein Aung said that 283.21 acres of land confiscated for No. 5 Textile Factory in Pakokku and 1,926.85 acres of land Seikpyu confiscated for one of the projects of the ministry have been handed over to Magway Region Government since 7 December 2013 as the projects were

Deputy Minister for Construction U Soe Tint said that Punhlaing Golf Resort was implemented with the approval of the Myanmar Investment Commission on 652 acres of land. Although a total of 67 farmers complained about the land confiscated for the project, only thirteen of them could provide receipts for farmland tax. Four of the thirteen farmers have been compensated K 395.2 million for 39.52 acres of land, according to the deputy minister. The minister also said that 9.46



acres of land confiscated for Yadanabon Bridge will be handed over to Mandalay Region Government.

Afterwards, the representatives approved the reports on settlement of confiscation issues

and urged the union government to implement the recommendations.

GIZ is an agency which provides technical assistance and is carrying out activities especially for private sector development, financial sector development and human resource development.

GIZ is providing the

ministries and Republic of the Union of Myanmar Federation of Chambers of Commerce and Industry with technical assistance and has helped drawing policies for SME bill and economic development of the country.

As part of the financial cooperation with Myanmar, GIZ has also set aside 7 million Euros to inject into the rural area development in Myanmar, and out of 7 million Euros, 5 million will be spend on upgrading the roads in Shan State.

Meanwhile, joining hands with the EU, is supporting the cooperation between Myanmar Police Force, non-governmental organizations and media.

KfW State-owned Bank will spend 20 million euro in conducting on-job training courses, development of transportation sector in rural areas and development of infrastructure in Myanmar within the first year after it launched operation in Myanmar.





Japan, Australia to speed up work on defence cooperation pact

New York, 25 Sept — Japanese Prime Minister Shinzo Abe and his Australian counterpart Tony Abbott agreed on Wednesday to accelerate work toward signing a new pact aimed at facilitating joint exercises and operations between their defence forces.

"We would like to work on our security cooperation in a positive manner and to start arrangements for the new pact as early as possible," Abe was quoted by a Japanese government official as telling Abbott in New York.

Their meeting came on the sidelines of the UN General Assembly.

The new defence pact is designed to strengthen cooperation in the fields of Australia and the United

security and disaster relief between Japan's Self-Defence Forces and the Australian military.

A joint statement issued after their summit meeting in Canberra in July said the two countries are to open talks between their foreign and defence ministry officials.

Abe and Abbott also agreed to work closely together to maintain peace and stability in the Asia-Pacific region, along with India and the United States, said Deputy Chief Cabinet Secretary Hiroshige Seko, who briefed reporters on their meeting held over sushi lunch.

"First of all, trilateral cooperation between Japan, States is very important for peace and stability in the region," Abe was quoted as

The two leaders shared the view that cooperation between Japan, Australia and India is also important for the Indo-Pacific region, according to the spokes-

Abe and Abbott also discussed the US-led fight against the Islamic State militant group, an already signed bilateral free trade deal and the broader Trans-Pacific Partnership initiative.

Earlier Wednesday, Abe had separate meetings with Panamanian President Juan Carlos Varela and UN Secretary General Ban Kimoon.—Kyodo News

Sri Lanka president uses UN speech to assail war crimes probe

United Nations, 25 Sept — Sri Lankan President Mahinda Rajapaksa assailed the United Nations Human Rights Council on Wednesday in his address

to the UN General Assembly, calling its probe into Sri Lanka's 26-year civil war disproportionate and politically motivated.

Sri Lanka has refused

to cooperate with the Human Rights Council's investigation into the deaths of some 100,000 people since it was announced in March, despite mounting international pressure to issue visas to UN investi-

"Post-conflict Sri Lanka has also become an unfortunate victim of ill-conceived agendas of some in the Human Rights Council," Rajapaksa said in his address to the 193-member UN General Assembly, adding that the body was overlooking Sri Lanka's "substantial progress" since the war ended in 2009.

"There is an obvious lack of balance and proportion in the manner in which my country is being targeted today," he said, adding

that there were more pressing emergencies elsewhere in the world.

'External intervention without adequate consideration of the structures in a society and cultural traditions of the countries where such intervention takes place, inevitably results in detribalization," he said.

The United Nations estimated in a 2011 report that about 40,000 Tamil civilians were killed in the final weeks of the war, mostly by the army. Sri Lanka has rejected the allegation and said it was conducting its own investigation.

The Human Rights Council, in voting to investigate the deaths of some 100,000 in March, said Sri Lanka had failed to investigate properly.—Reuters

Vietnam welcomes efforts by US to end its weapons embargo

New York, 25 Sept — Vietnam would welcome an end to the arms embargo clamped on it by the United States, the country's foreign minister said on Wednesday, as he played down the notion that the move would inflame Hanoi's maritime dispute with China.

Pham Binh Minh, who also serves as Vietnam's deputy prime minister, was responding to a Reuters report on Tuesday that said Washington was moving closer to lifting the embargo to help Vietnam deal with growing naval challenges from China.

US officials knowledge of the initiative said unarmed Lockheed Martin P-3 Orion surveillance planes could be among the first US sales, to strengthen Vietnam's ability to monitor and defend its coastline.

Pham suggested that

lifting the arms embargo was almost a routine step in the gradual resumption of links between the United States and Vietnam, which accelerated with a series of high-level diplomatic and military meetings in recent months.

"Nearly 20 years ago, normalized relations with the United States and in 2013 we set up a comprehensive partnership with the United States,' Pham said during an event at the Asia Society in New York, a few blocks from where the United Nations General Assembly was taking place.

UN Security Council adopts resolution curbing flow of terrorists

New York, 25 Sept -The United Nations Security Council on Wednesday unanimously backed a resolution calling on countries to tighten the movement of foreign terrorists who are increasingly flocking to hotspots around the globe, most recently in Syria and Iraq. "The historic resolution that we just adopted enshrines our commitment to meet this challenge," US President Barack Obama told council members in remarks after the vote was cast. "It is legally binding. It establishes new obligations that nations must meet."

As the United States is serving as the rotating council president for the month, Obama called the high level meeting attended by leaders from more than 50 countries. The resolution, he said, garnered more than 100 cosponsors.

Obama pointed out that there were an estimat-

The resolution decides that member states should "prevent and suppress the organizing, recruiting, transporting or equipping" of fighters who travel to countries where extremists gather, as well as the financing of their travel or activities.

It is aimed at groups, such as the Islamic State, the Nusra Front and other splinter groups of al-Qaeda. The United States sponsored resolution is under Chapter 7 of the UN Charter — making it legally binding — and spells out that such foreign fighters are a "threat to international peace and security."

The text also calls on countries to "prevent the entry into or transit through" territories of individuals who states have reason to believe are affiliated with suspected groups.

Fuele: First two chapters may open by end of year



New York, 25 Sept — EU Enlargement Commissioner Stefan Fuele believes that there is a chance for Brussels and Belgrade to cross an important threshold before the year ends and to open the first two of 35 policy chapters which Serbia must address to join the EU.

"I think we st that would be possible before the end of this year," Fuele said in an interview for Wall Street Journal.

Nevertheless, warned that progress depends on the member states as well as Belgrade, since EU capitals must okay the

Fuele said that the chapters dealing with regional affairs (Chapter

35) and financial controls (Chapter 32) are most likely to be opened first.

"EU member states, especially Germany, have pushed the EU to focus on justice and rule-of-law issues at the start of accession talks, noting the problems the EU's newest members have had with this." Wall Street Journal reported.

Fuele, who is due to leave the post in October, said that Brussels is working with Serbia on this matter and hopes to open the chapters on the judiciary and fundamental rights (Chapters 22 and 23) early next year. Nevertheless, progress in other areas is also necessary, he said.

Iran, P5+1 still disagree on key aspects of nuclear programme

United Nations, 25 Sept — Iran and the P5+1 (five permanent members of the UN Security Council and Germany) have so far failed to resolve their disagreements over key issues that need to be cleared before the final agreement on the Iranian nuclear programme can be signed, Russian Deputy Foreign

Minister Sergei Ryabkov said on Wednesday.

Ryabkov, who is leading the Russian delegation at the current round of talks, said earlier that the most challenging issues were the Arak reactor, uranium enrichment, verification, and the closure of the so-called military dimensions of the Iranian nuclear

programme. He added that there was no reason yet to hold a ministerial meeting of between Iran and the

"A ministerial meeting will depend on whether at least some of the solutions to the main issues can be stated. There is none so far, unfortunately," he said.

Japan ready to ease, lift sanctions against Russia

Токуо, 25 Sept — Јаpan is ready to ease or lift extra sanctions against Russia if Moscow takes action toward a peaceful settlement of the crisis in Ukraine, Foreign Minister Fumio Kishida said in a statement on Thursday.

His statement is apparently aimed at minimizing reactions from Russia against the sanctions and realizing talks between Prime Minister Shinzo Abe and Russian President Vladimir Putin on the sidelines of a Pacific Rim summit to be held in Beijing in November. As for reasons of the sanctions, the statement issued by the Japanese Foreign Ministry also said there is no clear evidence that Russia has ceased attempts to destabilize the Ukraine situation.

The new set of sanctions, announced Wednesday, puts restrictions on exports to Russia of weapons and other items for military use, and on providing arms technology, while banning five Russian banks from issuing securities in Japan.

Caring and Sharing University Teachers

hy do people become teachers? It cannot be for the income, because in many countries, teaching is not a highly paid profession. It cannot be for the glamour because teaching is not a glamorous job as the main responsibilities are managing boisterous and energetic young people and ensuring that they learn. Nor can it be because the work is light as a teacher's job requires giving a lot of time and effort. I believe that in Myanmar society, the reasons for people choosing this profession may be because of the pleasure derived from sharing one's knowledge with others, the fondness for research, making new discoveries and lifelong learning, the ambition to contribute something new to their field of specialization, the opportunity to make positive transformations in the lives of students, the respect shown by society and the adoration they receive from students.

People are beginning to realize that the current century demands persons who do not just have specialized knowledge, but also possess the abilities to adapt and innovate to face the challenges of fast-paced changes and to work and survive in an increasingly complex environment. Hence, in this age, higher education institutions are regarded as centres that can equip students with cutting-edge knowledge, and creative thinking to be competitive in this demanding age, and social skills and

social responsibilities expected of educated persons. Therefore, at this juncture, when Myanmar is striving to catch up with other fast developing countries, it is important that teachers never forget the reasons why they have become teachers, the fact that those who aspire to become university teachers in the 21st century will need to already have advanced knowledge and the abilities that they must develop in their students, and the vital role universities are playing in the advancement of their country.

trust and confidence of their students, the first responsibility of university teachers is to take their classes regularly and teach effectively after carrying out careful preparations, because of the simple reason that students are enrolled at institutions to attend classes regularly and to learn from their teachers, and teachers are appointed at the institutions concerned to provide effective instruction to their students.

The next responsibility of the faculty is to carry out extensive and in-depth study of their field of specialization in order to keep spanding their capacity and knowledge base. In this connection, as all teachers know, to be able to absorb what they are reading, they must have a sound knowledge of English as most of the references used are published in English. Knowledge of ICT is also very useful in carrying out research and teachers must exert the necessary effort to

master it. In addition, to be able to profit from their reading and research, teachers themselves must master study skills. According to Cottrell, S. (2013) in her book The Study Skills Handbook (4th edn.) study skills consist of four types of skills: self-management skills for study, academic skills, people skills for studying with others, and task management skills. Moreover, as one of the responsibility of university teachers is to promote independent learning, so that students have the ability to learn by themselves from whatever sources available, teachers must develop the study skills of their students and encourage them to become independent learners, using as a springboard what they have learnt from teachers, to widen and deepen their knowledge.

At university level, students need to make more use of their thinking skills than the ability to memorize facts. Therefore, another responsibility of university teachers is to develop higher order thinking skills of students such as, assessing, analyzing, synthesizing, innovating, problem solving, making decisions, weighing the consequences of decisions made, assessing situations correctly, considering all aspects that needs to be considered, etc. As precursor or follow-up to their lectures, and during tutorials, teachers need to involve students in tasks, activities and assignments that will develop these thinking abilities so that students have the opportunity to practice higher order thinking skills that will also assist in devel-

oping maturity.

are important in many professions including teaching profession. Hence, it is a prerequisite for university teachers to have very good communication skills if their teaching is to be lucid, comprehensible, effective, persuasive and interesting. Whatever the discipline their students specialize in, university teachers must help them to promote these skills that will contribute to their current as well as future successes by giving them the opportunity to communicate in the lecture room. By allowing then to discuss what was dealt with in the lectures and by assigning them to do such tasks as presentations and projects, students' ability to present, question, respond, discuss, negotiate, argue, present, debate, etc. will definitely improve. If students are assigned to do the tasks in the form of group work with assignment of specific roles such as leader, rapporteur, note taker, etc., the skills to collaborate and play various roles in a team will also develop. If classes are large, and if group work is utilized as a teaching technique, then teachers will also need to be skilled in classroom management, that is, the techniques used by teachers in controlling students, handling activities and creating a cooperative learning environment.

Communication skills

As another main responsibility of university teachers is to provide cutting-edge knowledge and skills, they need to constantly carry out research, get their findings published in reputable research journal as contributions to the growth of their specialized field and also to provide

updated students with knowledge. Undertaking research is also important for another reason. By undertaking research for private enterprises seeking data and information to develop new products, income can be generated both for the university as well as for the teacher concerned. In addition, the prestige of the university is raised, as it can be seen to perform both the role of an academic institution as well as a research institution capable of catering to the research needs of the private sector and contributing to strengthening partnerships between industries, businesses and the

university. As academics, university teachers need to have professional pride and ambitions because without them they may not have the incentive to improve themselves. Hence, university teachers must emulate successful colleagues and strive to do further studies, locally and abroad, and to become leading members of the international academic community, in order to raise the prestige of their mother institutions as well as the education sector. Moreover, they must also be aware of their true abilities to know how hard they must work, just as they must know the abilities of their students so that they will know to what extent they have to pull and push

University teachers need to be aware of another responsibility. It is training new generations of academics for the higher education sector. As a result, they need to serve as good models both academically as well as ethically. Further-

more, whenever the opportunity arises, they need to inculcate in their students some of whom will become teachers, high moral principles and social responsibilities, humility, good attitude, and to think and act as befitting an educated person.

There are very few who do not have family responsibilities, but as teachers, in order to maintain the traditional respect that teachers have earned in Myanmar society, they must balance their professional responsibilities with their family obligations as too much of the former, or the latter, will affect the other

University teachers, most of whom are deeply committed to their profession, do not make many demands. As appreciation for their dedication and important service to the nurturing of youths of the nation, all they desire is a salary in commensurate with their status and importance of their work, fair treatment, a happy and conducive working environment, cooperation among colleagues to further promote their field of specialization, good research and library facilities to improve their teaching and carry out professional development, equal opportunities to continue their studies within the country and abroad, decent accommodation, if posted away from home, and reasonably convenient transport to work. In return, to be truly a teacher in the traditional Myanmar sense, university teachers should not just be persons with advanced degrees and knowledge, but they must be teachers who are also caring, sharing and giving priority to educating their students.



SpaceX Dragon capsule reaches space station

CAPE Canaveral, (Fla.) 25 Sept — A Space Exploration Technologies cargo ship carrying an experimental 3-D printer and a habitat with 20 mice arrived at the International Space Station on Tuesday, ending a two-day journey.

Working from inside station's windowed cupola module, flight engineer Alexander Gerst, a European Space Agency astronaut, used the station's 58-foot-long (18m) robotic arm to pluck the Dragon capsule from orbit at 6:52 am EDT as the ships sailed 262 miles (422 km) over the Pacific Ocean.

"This was, indeed, a great flight of Dragon," Gerst radioed to NASA Mission Control in Houston. "We're happy to have a new vehicle on board."

The capsule blasted off on Sunday from Cape Canaveral Air Force Station in Florida aboard a Falcon 9 rocket, which is built and flown by privately owned SpaceX, as the company is known. Including flights.—Reuters

New York, 25 Sept — Scientists who discovered phenomena as different as the molecular mechanisms of pain, organic light-emitting diodes that illuminate mobile phones and a new quantum state of matter are top contenders for Nobel prizes next month, according to an annual analysis by Thomson Reuters.

The predictions announced on Thursday come from the Intellectual Property & Science unit of Thomson Reuters (which also owns the Reuters news service). Since 2002, it has accurately predicted 35 Nobel laureates, including nine who won in the year of the forecast and 16 who won within two years.

IP&S, which sells data. bases its forecasts on scientists' citations, or references to their published papers by others.

Citations can reflect how influential a study

was, but are not a perfect benchmark. Breakthroughs in specialized fields could have few citations while a lesser finding in a popular one could have many.

But some citations are essentially tips-of-the-hat by one scientist to another and can indicate standing in a field. Since Nobel nominations come from past winners and other eminences, reputation counts.

The IP&S analysts predicted seven possible winners in medicine and physics and eight in chemistry. The Nobel committees honour a maximum of three scientists in each field, so predicting more than twice that number increases the odds of being right.

For the Nobel Prize in medicine, which will be announced on 6 October in Stockholm, the Thomson Reuters analysis shows deserving discoveries going back decades.

David Julius of the University of California, San Francisco, is in contention for discovering the cellular receptor for the hot-pepper molecule capsaicin in the late 1990s. He worked out how it is activated by capsaicin as well as heat, triggering pain.

Discoveries by three other contenders overturned the belief that humans are 99 percent alike at the DNA level. In 2004 one of the trio, Michael Wigler of Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory, found that more than 10 percent of the genome contains DNA that is duplicated as if by a biological photocopier run amok. Such "copy number variations" are associated with autism, schizophrenia and other devastating disorders.

This year might finally be the charm for breakthroughs from the early days of molecular genetics, specifically discoveries by James Darnell and Robert Roeder of Rockefeller University, and Robert Tjian of UC Berkely, of how DNA is transcribed within cells so proteins can be synthesized. The Nobel Prize in physics, to be announced on 7 October, may also recognize achievement from a past decade.

One contender whom Thomson Reuters highlights is Charles Kresge of Saudi Aramco, whose breakthrough invention of molecular sieves, now used as industrial catalysts, came in 1992.

In chemistry, Ching Tang of Hong Kong University of Science and Technology and Steven Van Slyke of Silicon Valley start-up Kateeva Inc are in contention for inventing organic light-emitting diodes, which became ubiquitous in smartphones, tablets and high-definition televisions.— Reuters

Huawei to invest \$4 billion in fixed broadband **R&D** in next three years

Beijing, 25 Sept — Huawei Technologies Co Ltd [HWT.UL], the world's largest telecommunications equipment maker, said it would invest more than \$4 billion in fixed broadband technology research and development (R&D) in the next three years.

Huawei, which has shifted its focus to the mobile device market in recent years, said in a statement on Thursday that fixed broadband — the pipes connecting homes and offices remained a "key direction for strategic investment."

The Shenzhen-based company said it would research basic technologies such as photonics used in er of fixed-line switches,

fiber optic cables as well as software-defined network-

Huawei said investing in fixed broadband technology will be important given the rise of high-resolution video technology, which for instance powers 4K television sets as well as commercial big data operations that also consume significant bandwidth.

Fixed broadband has largely been overshadowed by the runaway growth of mobile broadband, which has grown 20 percent this year in worldwide users, according to a UN report this week.

Tabakovic: Open letter to Vucic on inflation

Belgrade, 25 Sept -Governor of the National Bank of Serbia (NBS) Jorgovanka Tabakovic sent an open letter to Serbian Prime Minister Aleksandar Vucic on Wednesday in which she explained the reasons for a lower inflation rate than this year's target inflation (4 plus or minus 1.5 percent) and informed him that according to NBS expectations, inflation rate should return to the limits of the target rate by the end of the year. The governor explained that the inflation rate was lower than originally planned due to unexpectedly low food prices, announced increase of electricity price which was not realised and stable developments on the foreign currency market.

The inter-annual inflation in August totalled 1.5 percent, and in the period from March to August 2014 it ranged below the expected target limits, the letter states.

The average inter-annual inflation rate in the period March-August totalled 1.9 percent and the price of food in the period dropped by 0.9 percent.— *Tanjug*

China, US to hold 15th annual defence talks

Beijing, 25 Sept — China and the United States will hold the 15th annual Defence Consultative Talks in mid-October in Washington DC, a Chinese defence ministry spokesman announced on Thursday.

Deputy Chief of the General Staff of the Chinese People's Liberation Army Wang Guanzhong will co-chair the talks with US Under Secretary of Defence Christine E Wormuth, spokesman Geng Yansheng said at a monthly press briefing.

The strategic planning departments of the two militaries will hold their first dialogue during the talks, Geng said.

The previous talks were held on 9 September, 2013 in Beijing.—*Xinhua*

Australia to reintroduce temporary visas for refugees

SYDNEY, 25 Sept — Australia will reintroduce a controversial temporary visa system to deal with a huge backlog of asylum seekers, its immigration minister said on Thursday, despite criticism the stopgap process leaves refugees in limbo.

Conservative Prime Minister Tony Abbott won an election last September after campaigning on tough immigration policies, which have been criticized internationally but which polls show remain popular with voters.

Australia uses offshore detention centers in Papua New Guinea and the tiny South Pacific island nation of Nauru to process would-be refugees who arrive on boats, but some 30,000 who arrived before the policy was set are awaiting processing in Australian detention centres.

Immigration Minister Scott Morrison said that the Temporary Protection Visas (TPV), which were introduced under former Prime Minister John Howard and abolished in 2008, would address those people without providing inducements to people smugglers.

"TPVs will provide refugees with stability and a chance to get on with their lives, while at the same time guaranteeing that people smugglers do not have a 'permanent protection visa product' to sell to those who are thinking of traveling illegally to Australia," he

told reporters.

The opposition Labour Party said it opposed temporary protection visas as leaving asylum seekers in limbo without a pathway to citizenship, but would study the proposed legislation

Morrison said a deal had been reached with mining magnate Clive Palmer, whose Palmer United Party virtually controls the balance of power in the Senate, which nearly ensures its passage through Parliament.

About 16,000 asylum seekers came to Australia on 220 boats in the first seven months of 2013, but the government says there has been just one "illegal" boat arrival since December. Hundreds of asylum seekers have drowned when rickety boats, mostly from Indonesia, have sunk en route in recent years.

Under the legislation, Palmer said that refugees would be allowed into Australia for an initial period of five years, during which time they would be allowed to work, provided they go to a remote area in need of labourers.

"There are many areas and many communities in our country that can't get labor," Palmer told reporters in Brisbane.—*Reuters*

Mexico City, 25 Sept — Mexican federal congressman Gabriel Gomez, the most high-profile politician murdered in recent years, was likely executed by a drug cartel, a state prosecutor said on Wednesday.

Gomez was kidnapped with an aide in Mexico's second-largest city of Guadalajara on Monday. Their charred remains were found in a burned-out pick-up truck the following day. The identities of Gomez and his assistant Heriberto Nunez were confirmed on Wednesday.

Rogic was a noticeable absentee from Postecoglou's squad named on Thursday for friendlies against the United Arab Emirates and Oatar next month and the coach said it was unlikely the Celtic player would be fit in time for the 9-31 January tournament in Australia.

"Tommy's had a little bit of a setback and I understand he's had to have another operation which will mean another lengthy

absence," Postecoglou told reporters in Melbourne.

"So that probably rules him out of Asian Cup calculation. He's still got a fair bit of work to do in rehab.

"Our medical department has been speaking to him and they've been getting me regular updates.

"It's disappointing for him obviously because he wants to get back playing."

The 21-year-old attacking midfielder was highly rated by Postecoglou, but the groin injury prevented him from imposing himself on opposition defences in the Socceroos' matches before the World Cup and he was left out of the final squad for Brazil.—Reuters

London, 25 Sept — Frank Lampard and Edin Dzeko scored twice as holders Manchester City sailed into the English League Cup fourth round with a crushing 7-0 win over Sheffield on Wednesday and Chelsea beat Bolton Wanderers 2-1 on Wednesday.

After struggling to break down their Championship (second tier) opponents in the first half, City produced a blistering spell of four goals in 13 minutes immediately after the break.

Lampard opened the scoring just three days after netting against his former club Chelsea before Dzeko, Jesus Navas, Yaya Toure, Dzeko, Jose Pozo and Lampard completed the rout.

"I really enjoyed that because tonight we saw the team that we were used to seeing last year," City manager Manuel Pellegrini told reporters.

"We have not been scoring so many goals at home so it is the first game we have returned to the team that everyone saw here last year. It is important to try to retain the trophy but the most important thing tonight was to play like we did."

Chelsea, top of the Premier League and unbeaten in all competitions this season, had Kurt Zouma's equaliser cancelled out by Matt Mills before Oscar's skidding low shot in the 55th minute secured a victory that was more comfortable than the scoreline suggested.

Elsewhere, Ryan Mason, Roberto Soldado and Harry Kane scored late goals as Tottenham Hotspur came from behind to beat Championship leaders Nottingham Forest 3-1.

Paul Dummett scored in extra time after Emma-

At Stamford Bridge, Chelsea named a similarly impressive starting line-up

and took control from the opening whistle without scoring the goals that reflected their dominance. After German World Cup winner Andre Schuerrle had gone close twice in quick succession, highly-rated 19-year-old Zouma grabbed a debut goal.

Bolton restored parity through Mills's commanding header six minutes later and Chelsea squandered chance after chance before Oscar added a second with an accurate long-range strike. The hosts could have paid for their wastefulness but Bolton failed to seriously trouble Petr Cech, playing his first game of the season after being displaced in goal by Thibaut Courtois, in a late spell of pressure.

"The players' mentality was good and we played with good ambition but we had problems with Bolton's height," Chelsea assistant coach Steve Holland said.

"Players getting important minutes, no extra-time and no new injuries is a good situation." Championship Brighton & Hove Albion comfortably overcame fourth tier Burton Albion 3-0.—Reuters

China wins men's rifle prone in world-recordbreaking style

INCHEON, 25 Sept — The Chinese trio of Zhao Shengbo, Lan Xing and Liu Gang clinched the gold medal of the men's 50m rifle prone team finals with a new world record of 1,876.0 points at the Incheon Asian Games on Thursday.

In the qualification stage, the Chinese team underlined their superiority with Zhao showing his best. He scored 104.4, 103.7, 104.0, 103.6, 105.0, 105.5 points in six rounds and entered the individual finals with a total of 626.2 points, ranking first at the top-eight list.

The Chinese team bettered the previous record of 1,873.6 by the French team of Cyril Graff, Michael Halluin and Valerian Sauveplane at the European championships in Croatia last year.

China avenged their loss to South Korea at the 2010 Asiad in Guangzhou as host marksmen You Jaejin, Park Bongduk and Kwon Juncheol combined for 1,869.0 points for the silver with Kazakhstan retaining the bronze with

Minutes later, Zhao topped the podium again in the individual final, edging Muhammad Ezuan Bin Nasir Khan of Malaysia into second place by 0.6 points.

The Malaysian scored 209.1 points while South Korean Park had bronze.

INCHEON, 25 Sept Ai Ueda captured the gold medal in a 1-2 finish for Japan in the women's triathlon at the Asian Games on Thursday.
