

**THE TRADE DISPUTES (SECOND AMENDMENT) ACT, 1951.**

[ACT NO. LXXI. OF 1951.]

It is hereby enacted as follows :—

1. This Act may be called the Trade Disputes (Second Amendment) Act, 1951.

2. In section 27 of the Trade Disputes Act the following *shall be inserted* as sub-section (3B) thereof, namely :—

“(3B) Every Conciliation Officer shall have power to serve notice on any party to a trade dispute and after serving notice compel such party to send its accredited representative to attend and participate in a conciliation proceeding before him, if he is satisfied that there is no likelihood of such a dispute being settled between the parties concerned without his intervention.”
